Black enrollment less than anticipated—it's 7.3%

Black enrollment at the Ann Arbor campus this fall totals 7.3 per cent—rather than the anticipated 8.6 per cent announced last spring.

Fewer black freshmen actually enrolling along with a loss of upperclass students account for the less-than-expected black enrollment, says George D. Goodman, director of the Opportunity Program.

Freshmen—

An enrollment of 132 less Opportunity Program freshmen over 1972 enrollment, according to Goodman, indicates a "leveling off period."

"We believe that some of the

students who were admitted but failed to enroll elected to go to other four-year or two-year schools," he says, "some probably did not enroll in any school with reasons varying from perceived financial difficulty to uncertainty

about the relevance of higher education to vocational upward mobility."

While the number of Opportunity undergraduate applications received during the past three years has steadily increased, the

increase in freshman applications has "slowed down." The increase rate of these applications was six per cent less than the increase rate last year. Number of admissions granted has steadily in-

creased over those three years.

In addition, an increasing number of Opportunity students are not eligible for financial aid—down from 85 per cent eligible last year to 70-75 per cent this year.

Upperclass attrition—

A smaller number of sophomores and juniors re-enrolled this fall than expected, says Goodman. "Some of these withdrawals were involuntary and related primarily to academic difficulty. In addition there have been voluntary withdrawals." While there appear to be fewer minority students in this category than that of all other undergraduates, Goodman notes, these students tend to depart without seeking or getting consultation in advance.

Those students who did not re-enroll last year were sent follow-up letters. About 40 per cent replied, according to Goodman, and gave a variety of reasons including personal and family problems and financial pressures.

"But there was considerable emphasis" reports Goodman, "on uncertainty about the relevance of their courses to careers, difficulty in choosing majors and changing majors, a feeling of social alienation and alienation from teaching fellows and faculty. "While several were employed in relatively varying factory or clerical tasks and had no plans for further education, others enrolled in other schools or were planning to do so ultimately.

"It appears that more attention and assistance is necessary for the students who remain in the University beyond the freshman year and particularly for those who are managing adequately academically."

Freshman attrition rate was "excellent" Goodman points out. Of the 412 entering 1972 freshmen, 352 returned for the sophomore year.

A "slow down"—

"In terms of a slow down in our progress, it is reasonable to expect—if existing levels stay in effect—that it will be two years away before we reach the goal of 10 per cent black enrollment," says Goodman.

He notes that the many variables involved, though, could provide for a "surprise" in either direction—moving toward the goal more quickly or slowly.

Goodman says that before he would recommend a step-up in any recruiting program, the total "support program" picture should be looked into.

One of the statistical problems in attaining the goal, Goodman points out, is that the 10 per cent goal was based on in-state students which account for 87 per cent of new freshmen and 84 per cent of transfer students. The black and minority enrollment statistics are figured on total Ann Arbor campus enrollment.

This fall, the increase in Ann Arbor enrollment of over 500 students, says Goodman, was not anticipated last spring when the 8.6 per cent projection was made.

The minority enrollment statistics and Goodman's observations will be a topic at this month's Regents' meeting.

Budgets 'n planning-2

'Priorities' report: key issues, possible disbandment

(This week's story on the Budget Priorities Committee is the second in a series of stories on the reports from the three committees within the President's Office of Budgets and Planning.)

(The first story in this series, "Record" Nov. 26, 1973, examined the Long-Range Planning Committee's activities as part of the Office of Budgets and Planning established in Spring, 1972, and their recommendations for zero enrollment growth, and the need to strengthen planning and coordination statewide.)

For the past fifteen months, the Budget Priorities Committee, has been analyzing, evaluating, and

submitting its recommendations on key budget priority issues for the University to the president's office.

—And one of the strategic recommendations from the committee comes in this most recent report—possible disbandment.

In the report, Thomas M. Dunn, committee chairman and professor of chemistry, states that "probably the committee's most noteworthy accomplishment to date has been the acquisition of the background necessary to understand the University's fiscal process, both internal and external."

He says the committee's most serious difficulty, which continues to plague them, is its lack of a definitive, viable area of responsibility.

The committee has evaluated and endorsed several administrative recommendations regarding budget request documentation and

budgetary legislation in Lansing, the committee states there is a "real danger" that the committee might assume a rubber stamp character, particularly at critical times when action is mandatory, but when the opportunity for discussion is limited by lack of both committee members and time.

Recommendations—

In the recommendations, they strongly advocate that the method of "across the board internal taxation" to achieve internal economies be discontinued.

Furthermore, the committee holds that their responsibility to evaluate the criteria on which present allocation of funds between existing units is based cannot proceed without some certainty about the future of the University as a whole, and that some sort of analysis and decision must be made before this can be accomplished.
