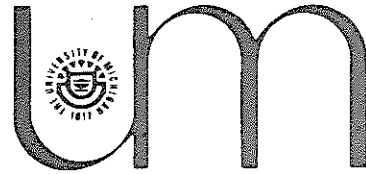

RELEASE ON RECEIPT

ANN ARBOR---Minority enrollment at The University of Michigan's Ann Arbor campus this fall is 3,425---or more than 10 per cent of the total enrollment.

The campus has 165 more minority students than it did a year ago. The percentage of minority students has increased from 9.64 last year to 10.11 this year.

The enrollment report was presented Thursday (Dec. 16) to the Regents by Richard A. English, U-M associate vice-president for academic affairs.

Of the minority students this year, 2,456 are black students, an increase of 13; 415 are Asian Americans, an increase of 27; 89 are Native Americans, an increase of 20; and 465 are Spanish-surnamed Americans, an increase of 105.

"Last year, 7.23 per cent of the total Ann Arbor campus enrollment was black, while this year the percentage is 7.25. Enrollments of Native American, Asian American and Spanish-surnamed students have increased substantially over last year," English said.

"Although the number of degrees awarded to minority students has increased slightly from 969 in 1974-75 to 987 in 1975-76, a significant expansion of 28.8 per cent---from 584 to 752---occurred in the number of degrees awarded to black students," English noted.

How to handle race, ethnic data request

explaining what information is needed and why.

Cash observes that, "When the University requests racial/ethnic data of students, they are informed that such information will be carefully safeguarded and released outside the institution only for reporting purposes and then only in summary form."

Cash, who is to review all such information planned for outside release—and internal distribution—notes particularly that students must attach their signature or give their written consent to the release of data which link their names with their race or ethnic background.

The guidelines do not prohibit an office from maintaining racial-ethnic information on students. They do require the permission of the President's Office, however, before such information can be shared with any other office or unit. The same requirement applies to obtaining such information from central computer files—such as the Student Characteristic Data Base maintained by the Registrar's Office.

The access policy stresses the need for security of student files and provides that name-linked racial/ethnic data be "destroyed when no longer needed."

Because of an increasing number of requests for racial and ethnic data on students and applicants, the University has formalized the handling of such requests. Until now, according to William Cash, assistant to the President, "this has been accom-

plished on an *ad hoc* basis" each time a unit has shown the need for such information. Deans and directors will receive copies of the access policy and procedures this week. What is required, essentially, is a written request to the President's Office
