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## FOREWORD

The statistical summary of the student population of The University of Michigan for the year 1959-60 is presented here by tabular and pictorial means. Enrollment information, honor-point averages, degrees granted, and other interesting data are summarized. Additional detailed information is available in the Statistical Service of the Office of Registration and Records.

The other services given by this office in the areas of orientation, registration, recording, compiling of the *University Directory*, Selective Service certification and counseling, and furnishing of diplomas and transcripts are briefly described. Comments and suggestions for the improvement of these services and this report are most welcome.

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## THE OFFICE OF REGISTRATION AND RECORDS

The residence credit enrollments for both the fall and spring semesters exceeded those of the previous year for the seventh time since 1952. In the fall of 1959, 23,988 students were enrolled for residence credit in degree programs. An additional 3,652 students were enrolled in credit courses at University centers. University-center enrollment decreased this year because it was necessary to eliminate some programs. Thus, the total enrollment in credit courses of 27,462 for the first semester was 945 less than the previous year. The total enrollment in credit courses for the year was 38,793. This is 7 more than the previous record set last year.

The student body was very similar to that of the previous year in composition. Of the fall enrollment 66.9 per cent were men (average age: 23.9 years). A further breakdown shows that 37.0 per cent were undergraduate men (average age: 20.9); 30.0 per cent were graduate men (average age: 28.4); 25.4 per cent were undergraduate women (average age: 20.2); and 7.7 per cent were graduate women (average age: 31.0). Michigan residents made up 65.7 per cent of the resident-credit students. Of the undergraduates, 25.0 per cent were freshmen, 24.3 per cent sophomores, 23.9 per cent juniors, and 22.9 per cent seniors; 3.9 per cent were classified as special students.

The freshman class of 3,227 entering in September was the largest freshman class ever to enter the University. A total of 3,432 freshmen entered the University during the fiscal year, of whom 53.7 per cent were men and 46.3 per cent were women. The ratio of Michigan to non-Michigan residents remained at two to one.

Every Michigan county, every state, the District of Columbia, the Canal Zone, Puerto Rico, and 83 foreign nations were represented in the student body during 1959-60.

The University granted a total of 6,239 degrees during the fiscal year. Of these, 50.5 per cent were bachelor's degrees, 33.9 per cent master's degrees, 4.7 per cent doctorates, and 10.9 per cent graduate-professional degrees in dentistry, law, medicine, public health, and social work. The number of degrees granted was 19.6 per cent of the total number of students enrolled in degree programs.

The thirty-seventh Honors Convocation, held on May 13, 1960, recognized the achievements of 813 undergraduate students, including upper-classmen who had earned at least a grade-point average of 3.5 for the preceding two semesters and freshmen who had earned this average for their first semester. Personnel in this office compiled the information necessary and submitted additional lists of the recipients of scholastic and extracurricular honors to the *Michigan Daily* for publication in the Honors Supplement. This supplement was distributed on the day of the Convocation, and copies of the program, together with a letter and a list of their former students who had been so honored, were sent to 156 Michigan high schools, 10 Michigan junior colleges, and 2 out-of-state junior colleges. Of the 813 students honored, 57 per cent were from Michigan high schools.

The tables and figures that follow summarize the student population at the University during the 1959-60 year. Several of the tables may appear changed from preceding years since more data has been added. Throughout these tables the term "Graduate," in the Student Group column, is used to indicate students in the Horace H. Rackham School of Graduate Studies.

The usual procedures were followed in reporting the number of students registered at the University. The year includes the 1959 summer session, the 1959-60 first semester, and the 1959-60 second semester. Only those students who remained past the total refund period of one week in the summer session or two weeks in either semester are included. Post-graduate registrations are considered short-course enrollments if enrollees remained less than four weeks in the summer or less than eight weeks during either semester. It should be noted that apparent numerical discrepancies in totals are the result of students who are enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total.

Extramural students in certificate programs in Group III are counted in the summary only. Other groups mentioned in the summary are included in the tables on geographical distribution of students, since they represent a service of instruction to the people of the state, the nation, and areas outside the continental United States. Geographical distributions are made according to the home address given by each student on his registration card.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follows:

I-A	Students in University degree or postgraduate professional residence credit level programs .....	31,788

The scholarship report for the year 1959-60 (see Tables XVIII through XXIV) concerns undergraduate students only. This report is being continued on a semester basis since it has been accepted so enthusiastically by the groups concerned.

The average earned by all men and women during the fall semester was 2.57; during the spring semester their average was 2.62. The women, as usual, maintained their higher average than the men by earning 2.67 in the fall and 2.68 in the spring. The men's average during the fall and spring semesters was 2.50 and 2.57, respectively. The new fall freshman class had a 2.40 average, which was a .01 improvement over a year ago. The freshman women of this group earned a 2.44 average and the men, a 2.37 average.

As indicated above, grades earned by students in the School of Dentistry, the Graduate School, the Law School, the Medical School, and the School of Social Work, and grades of graduate students in the School of Business Administration, the School of Music, the School of Natural Re-

sources, and the School of Public Health have been excluded from this summary. Freshmen are defined as students who entered the University in the fall of 1959 or in the spring of 1960 with less than one semester of college experience.

Another measure of academic success is the degree of persistence (Table XX) shown by fall freshmen in returning for the next semester. Nearly 95 per cent of the 3,227 fall freshmen continued in the University for the second semester.

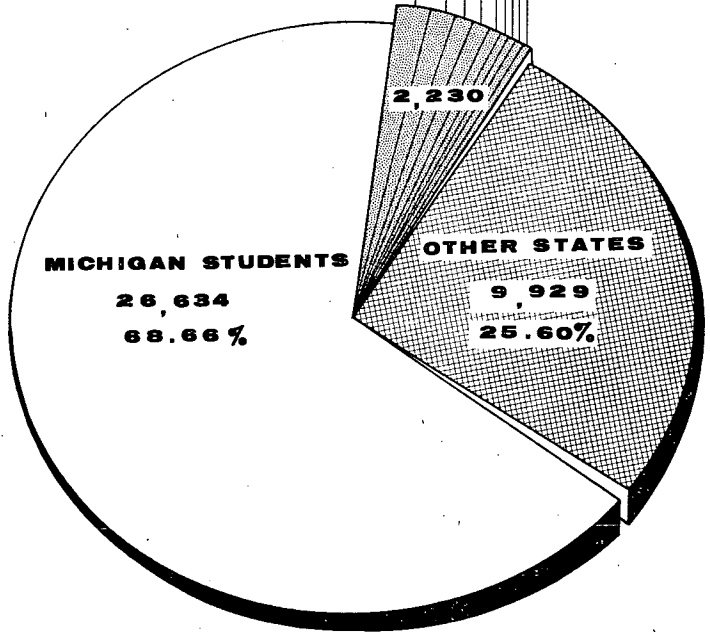

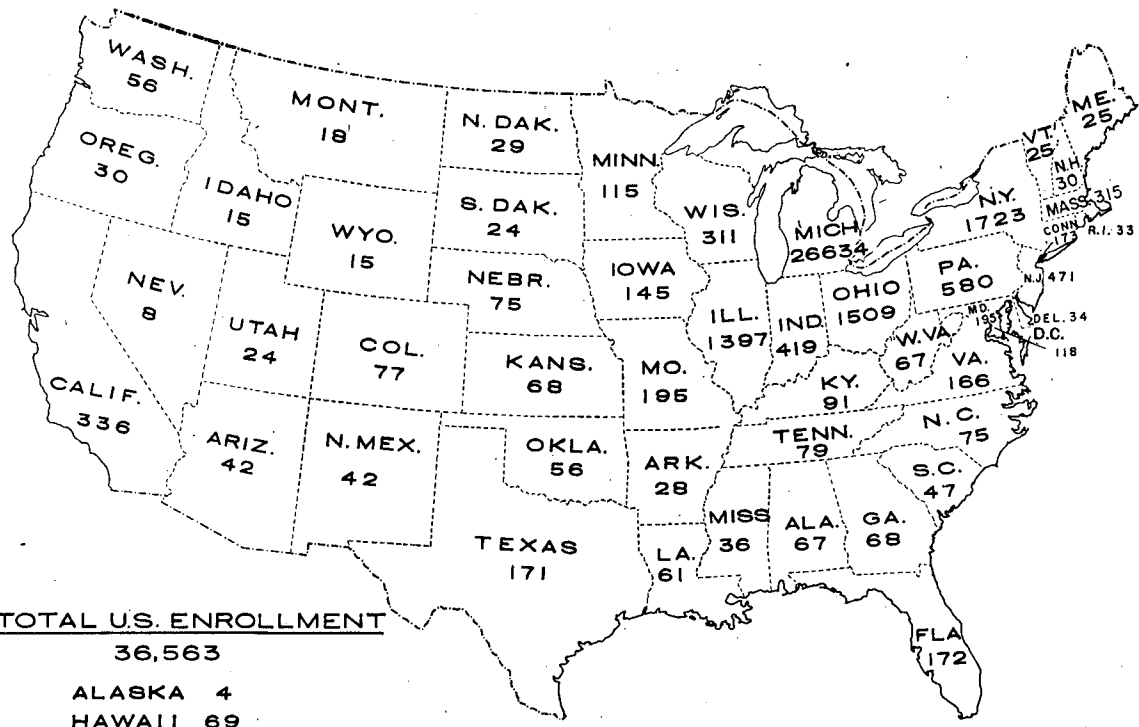

ENROLLMENT IN CREDIT AND PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMS FROM 1841-42 THROUGH 1959-60

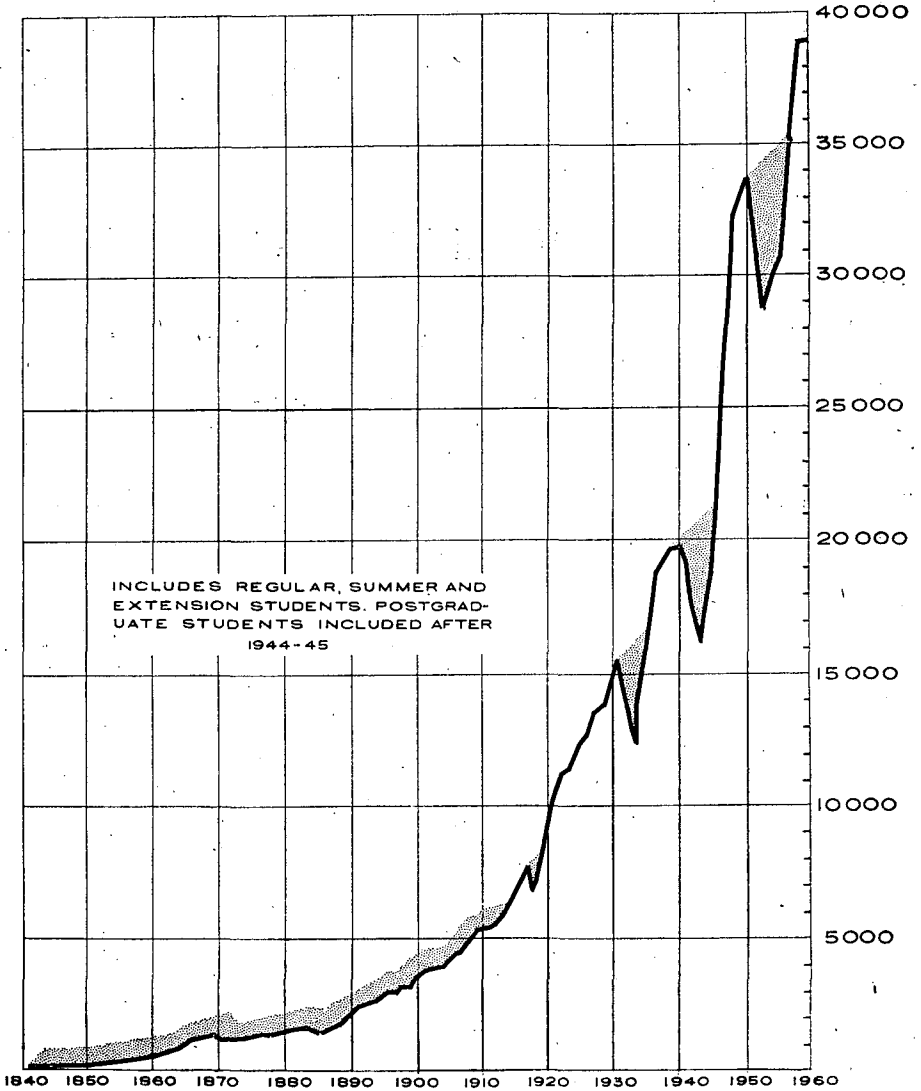

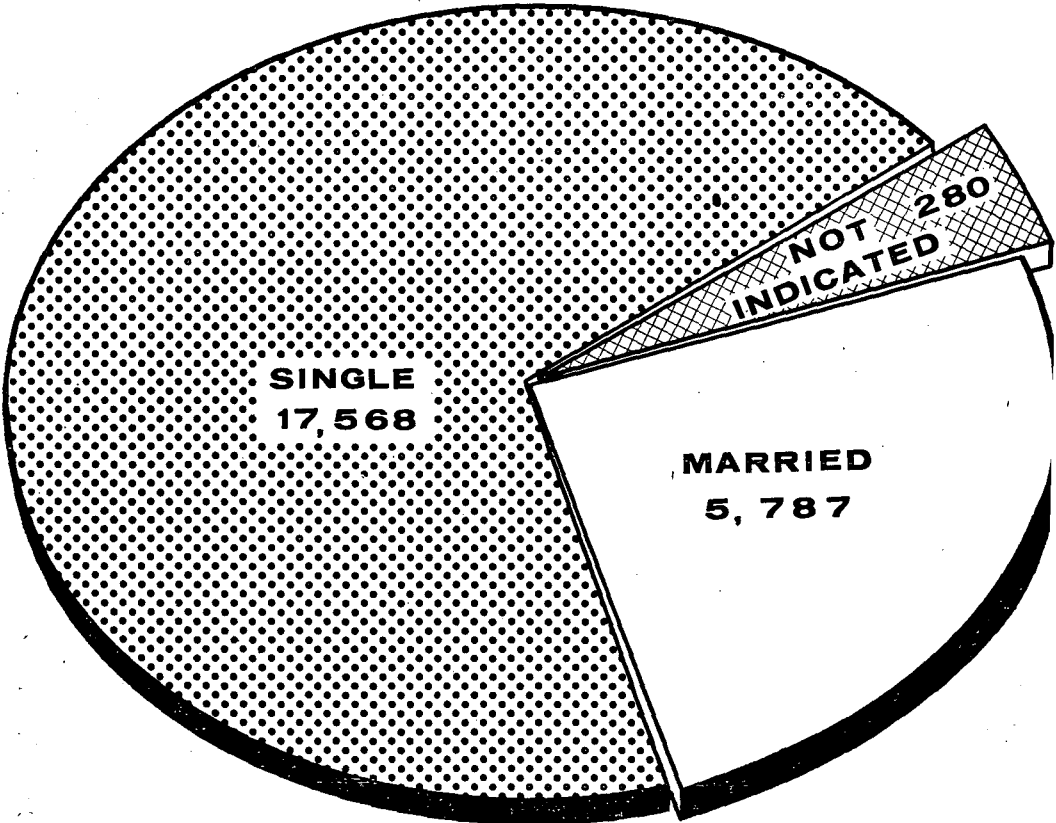

PREVIOUS COLLEGE EXPERIENCE\*

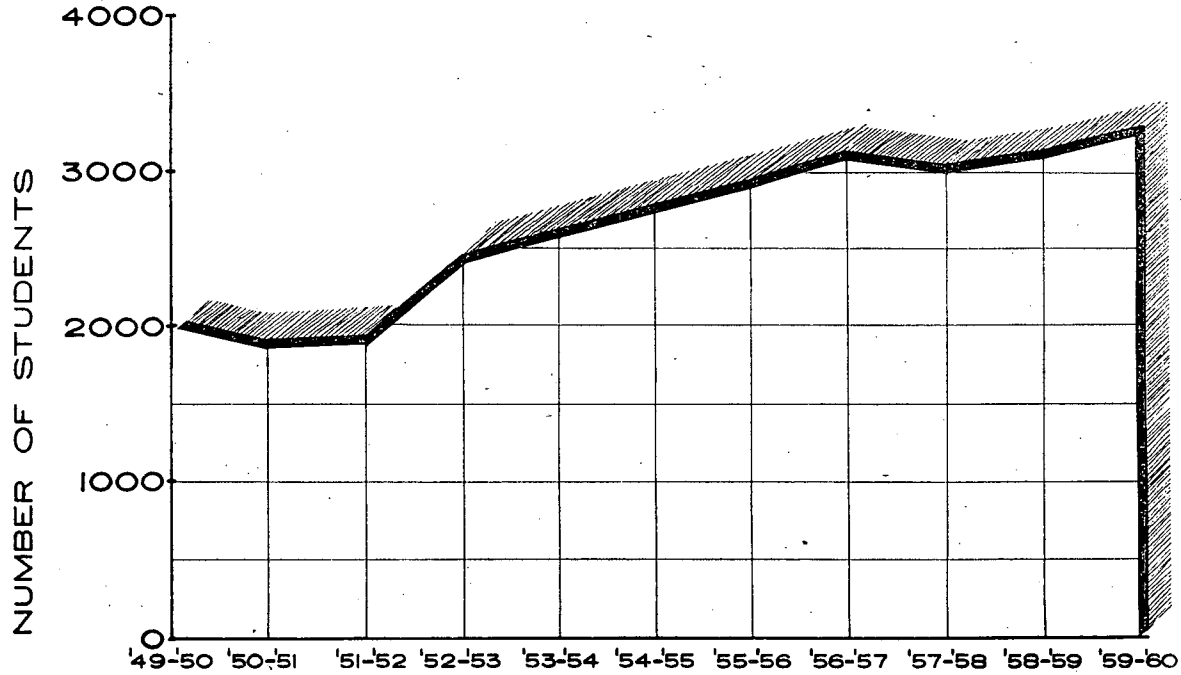

FIRST AND SECOND SEMESTER**

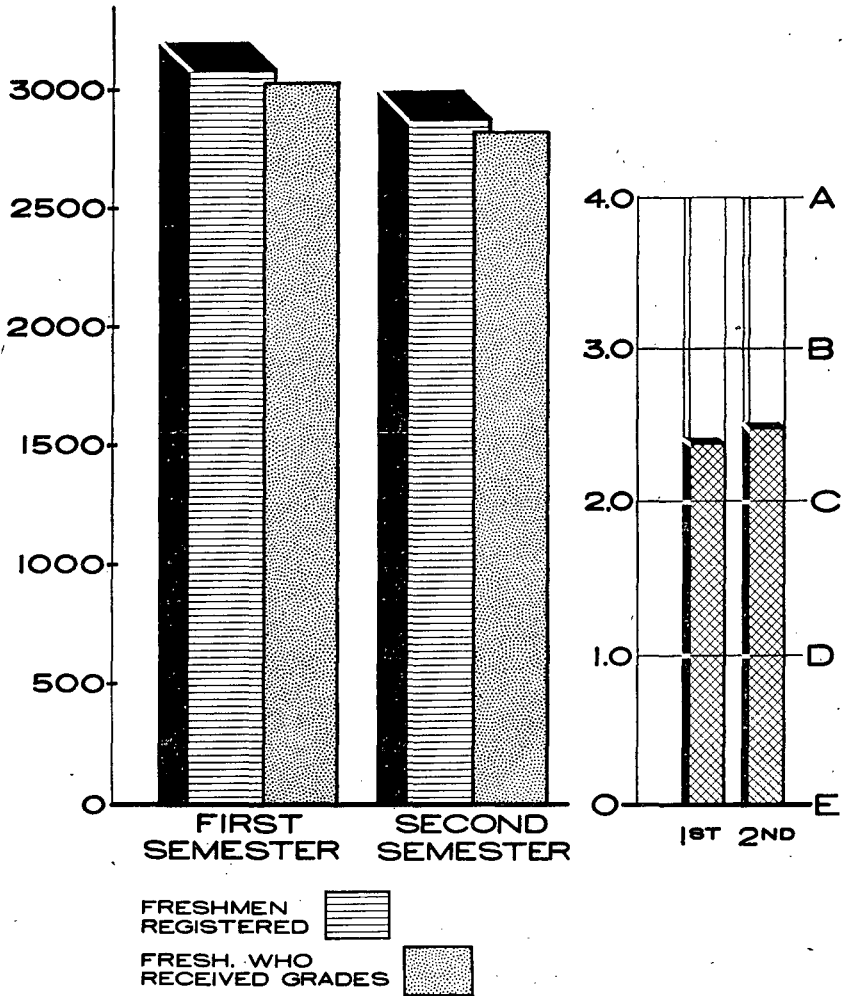

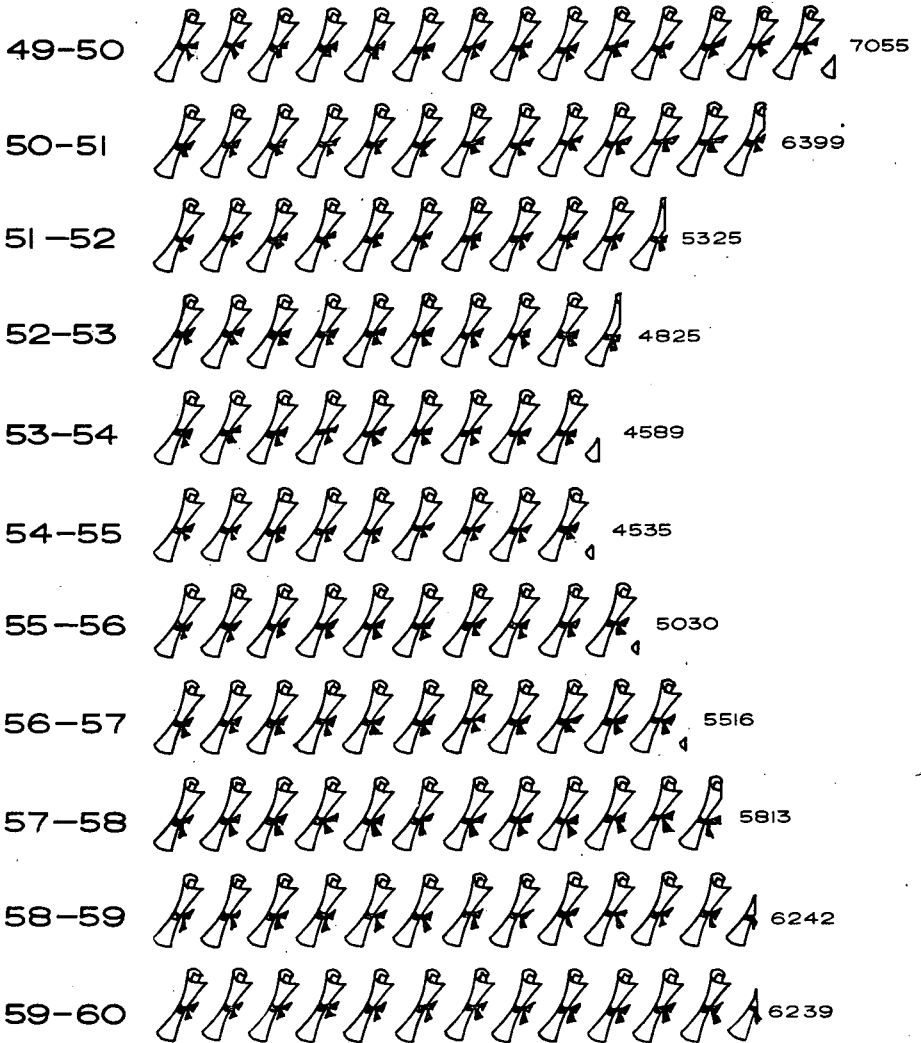
