THE OFFICE OF REGISTRATION AND RECORDS

ENROLLMENT

As in the past ten years the residence credit enrollment has exceeded the previous fall or spring semester. A three per cent increase over the previous fall brought the enrollment to 26,552. An additional 3,737 were enrolled in credit courses at University centers. The total credit enrollment was 39,905. This enrollment represents a 44 per cent increase since 1952-53.

The tables and figures that follow describe in detail the enrollment by period and unit at the University. Prescribed procedures were followed in accounting the number of students registered at the University. The year includes 1962 Summer Session, the 1962-63 first semester, and the 1962-63 second semester. Only those students who remained beyond the total refund in any period are included. Postgraduate registrations are considered to be short-course enrollments if less than four weeks in the summer or less than eight weeks during the regular semester. Any apparent numerical discrepancies in total are the result of students enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total.

Extramural students in certificate programs in Group III are counted in the summary only. All other groups mentioned in the summary are included in the table on geographical distribution of students since they constitute a service of instruction to the people of the state, the nation, and other areas.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follows:

I-A	Students in University degree or postgraduate professional residence credit-level programs	34,732

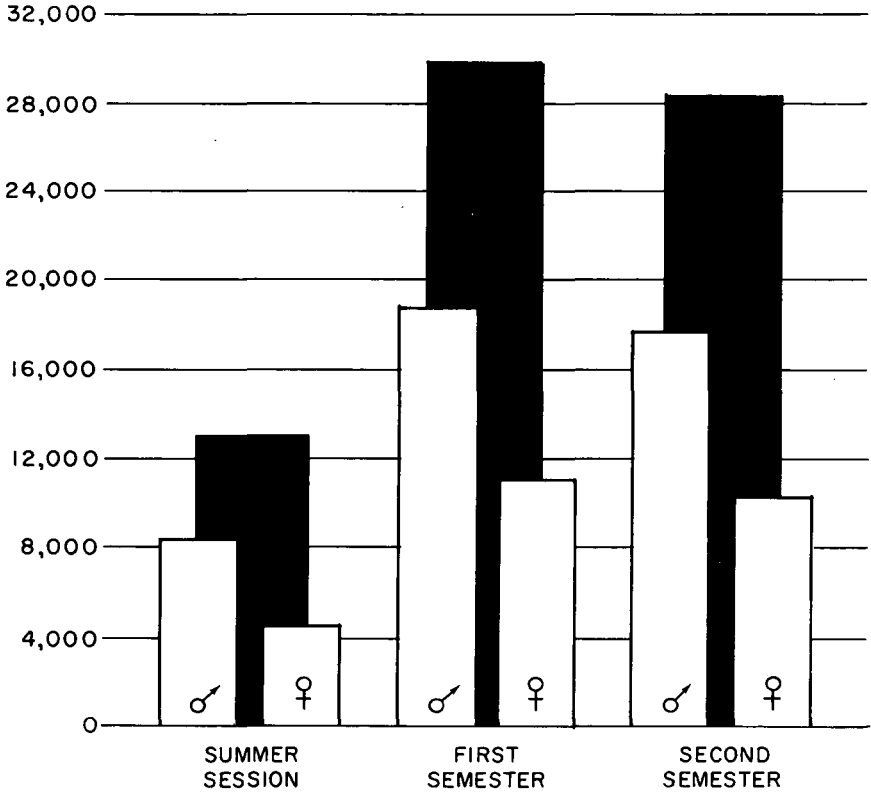

AFTER 1944-45

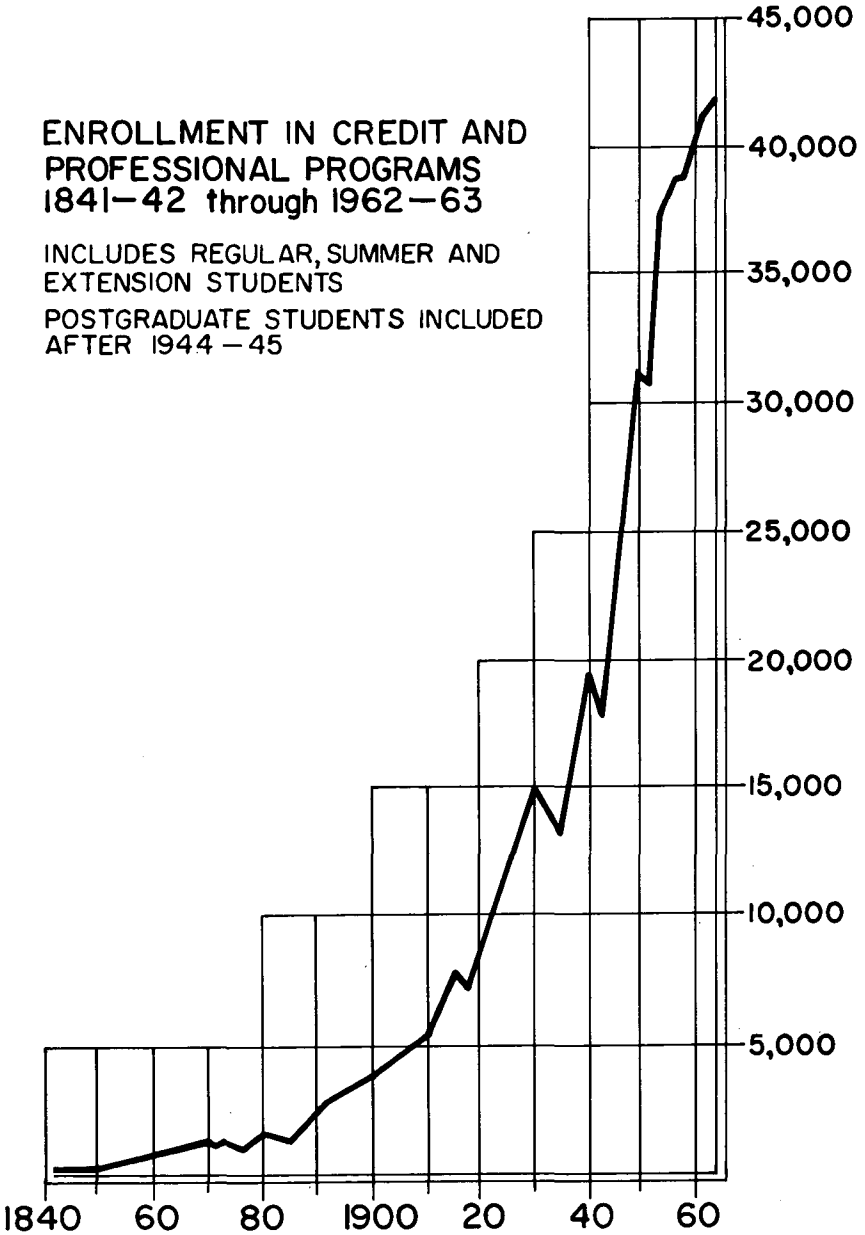

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE STUDENT POPULATION

The student population at the University can be described in numerous manners to exhibit its characteristics. Great interest is evident by the frequent requests for data. The tables that follow show enrollment by class level, marital status, and the enrollment by fields of specialization for the College of Literature, Science, and the Arts.

The graduate-level students continue to account for over 40 per cent of the student enrollment and during the summer session they account for over one-half.

Although the percentage of married students decreased slightly, the total again increased. With the exception of one year there has been a constant increase in the number of married students, especially evident in the enrollment of women.

†Seventeen students (15 men and 2 women) who registered in two units during the summer session of 1962 were counted once in these totals. Of these 17, 1 (1 man) was registered in two graduate units, 5 (3 men and 2 women) were registered in one undergraduate and one graduate unit; 2 (2 men) were registered in one undergraduate and one graduate-professional unit; 8 (8 men) were registered in one graduate and one graduate-professional unit; and 1 (1 man) was registered in two graduate-professional units.

‡Forty-three students (39 men and 4 women) who registered in two units during the first semester were counted once in these totals. Of these 43, 30 (26 men and 4 women) were registered in one graduate and one graduate-professional unit; 13 (13 men) were registered in one undergraduate and one graduate unit.

§Seventy-nine students (64 men and 15 women) who registered in two units during the second semester were counted once in these totals. Of these 79, 1 (1 man) was registered in two undergraduate units; 1 (1 man) was registered in two graduate units; 1 (1 man) was registered in two graduate-professional units; 36 (21 men and 15 women) were registered in one undergraduate and one graduate unit; 2 (2 men) were registered in one undergraduate and one graduate-professional unit; and 38 (38 men) were registered in one graduate and one graduate-professional unit.

1962-1963

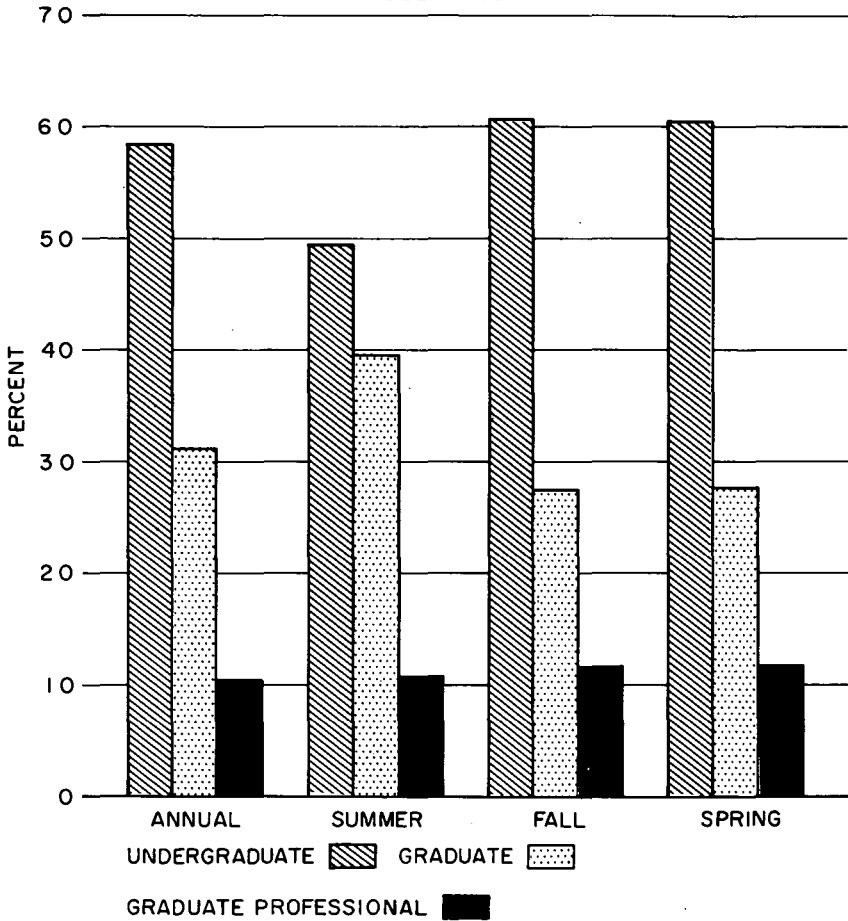

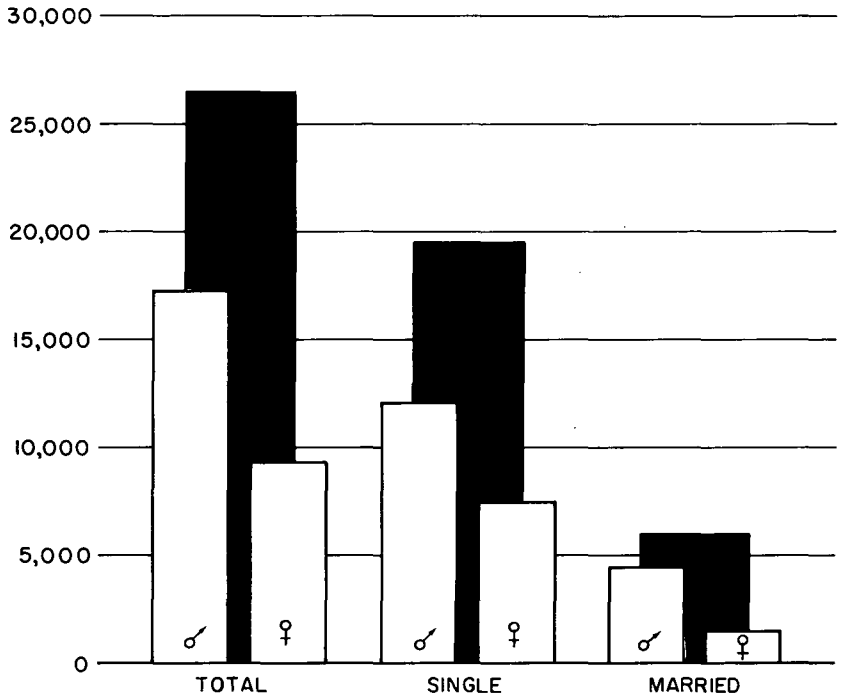

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

The academic achievement of undergraduate students for the year 1962-1963 is given in the tables that follow. These tables, as in the past, indicate the academic average of selected groups during the fall and spring semesters. The women, as usual, achieved higher averages than the men. The averages once again are higher than in the preceding semester.

No students in a graduate or graduate-professional unit are included. These are graduate-level students in the School of Business Administration, the School of Dentistry, the Graduate School, the Law School, the Medical School, the School of Music, the School of Natural Resources, College of Pharmacy, the School of Public Health, and the School of Social Work. In addition, students enrolled at the Dearborn Campus and at the Flint College are excluded.

A table indicating the grade-point averages by percentile ranking for selected schools is included. These averages are calculated for undergraduates who are enrolled in the same school or college both semesters and who elect twelve or more hours each semester.

The fortieth Honors Convocation, held on April 26, 1963, recognized the achievement of 1,012 undergraduate students who attained a grade-point average of 3.5 for the past two semesters or freshmen who had earned this average during the first semester. Since 1957 the percentage of eligible students honored has risen from 5.40 per cent to the current level of 6.56 per cent.

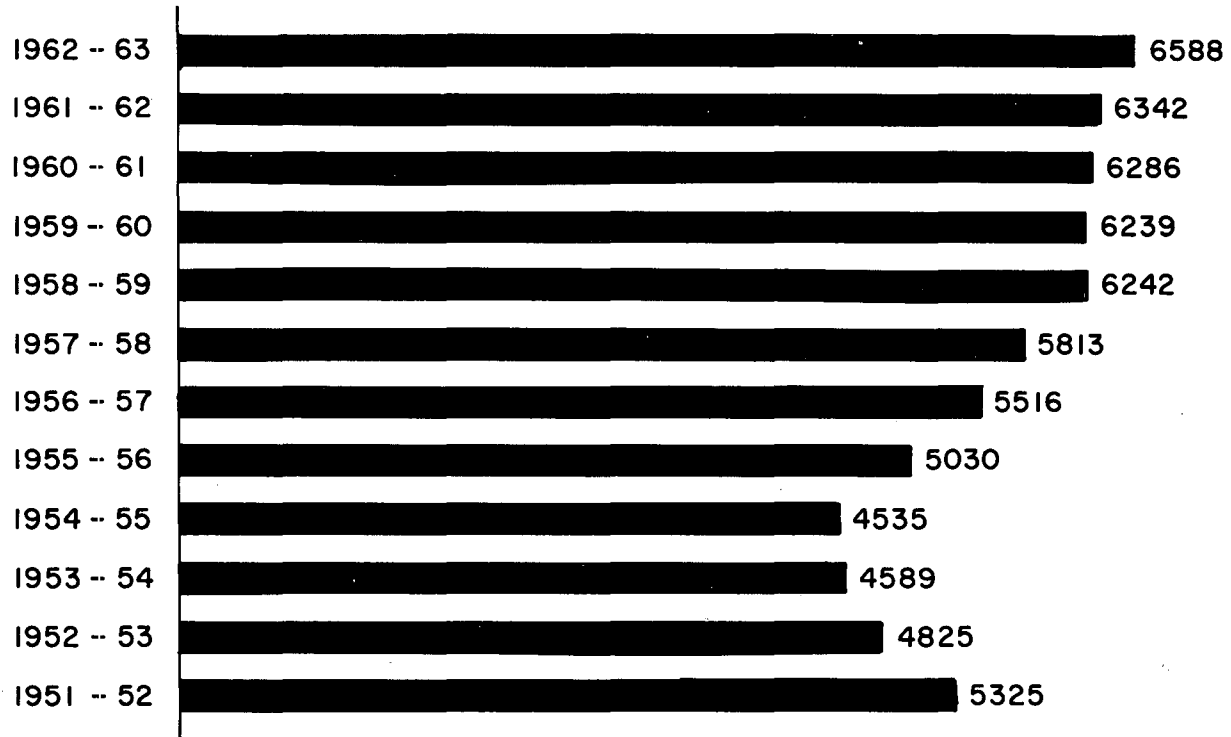

DEGREES AND AWARDS

Ninety-six different degrees in 179 fields of specialization for a total of 6,588 were conferred during the year. This number is more than 19 per cent of the total enrollment in degree programs. The ratio of degrees conferred was 18 per cent, 22 per cent, and 60 per cent in the summer, fall, and spring respectively. Of all the degrees granted, 49.5 per cent were bachelor's degrees, 32.8 per cent were master's degrees, 5.8 per cent were doctorates and 11.9 per cent were graduate-professional degrees. The national percentage of bachelor's and master's degrees is 81 and 16 per cent respectively.

A total of 201,027 degrees have been conferred by the University since 1845. From 1845 to 1944, 99,019 degrees were conferred and the other 102,008 were conferred from 1944-1945 to the present. President Hatcher has conferred 66,076 degrees in course since September, 1951.

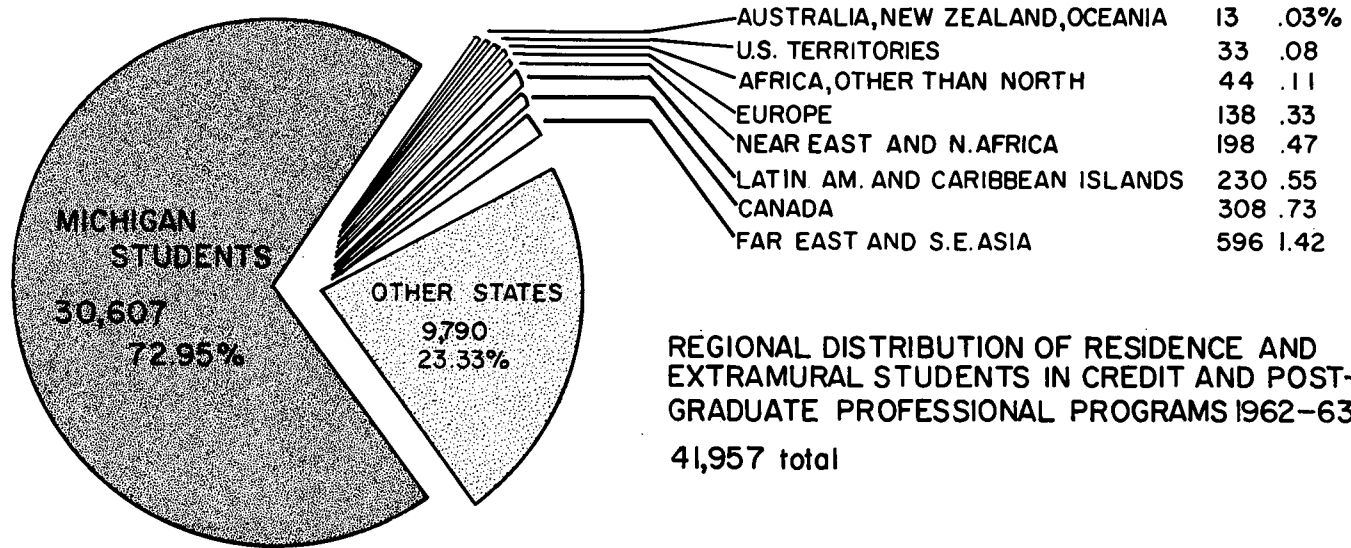

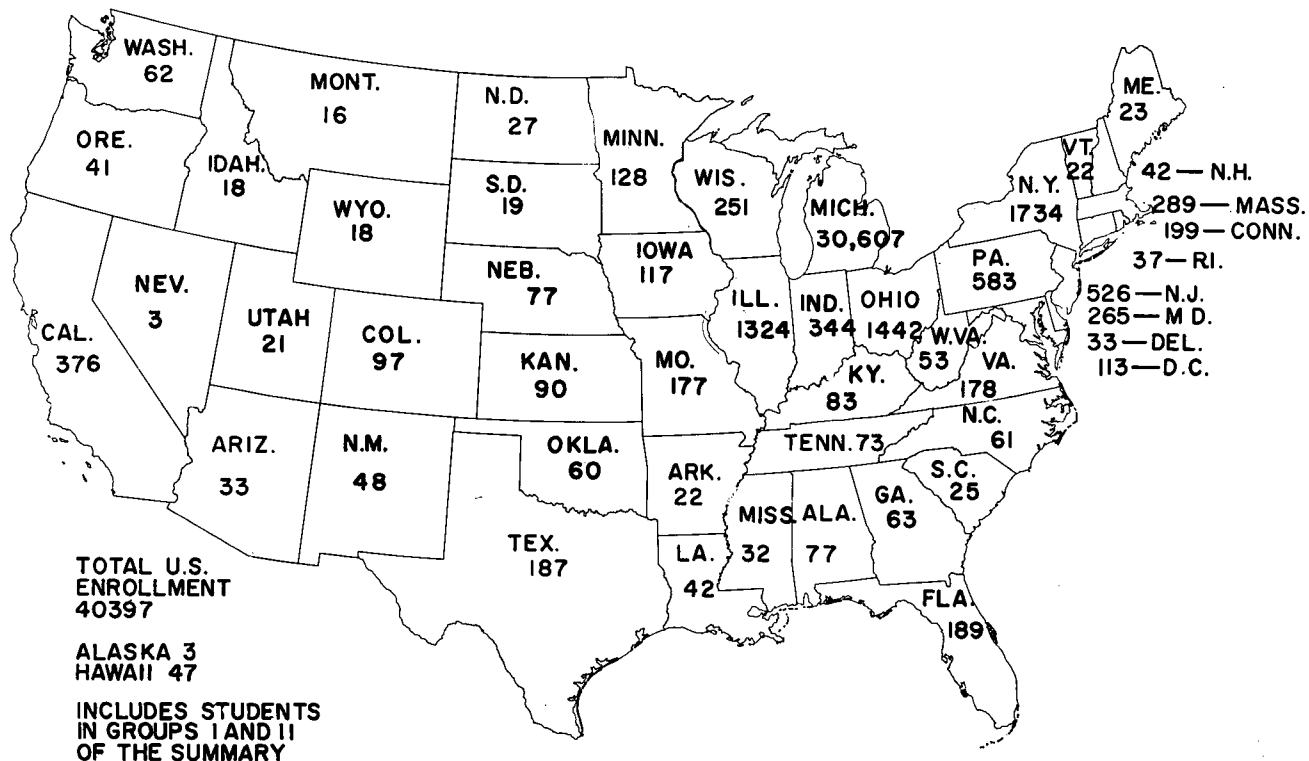

1962-63 ENROLLMENT BY COUNTIES

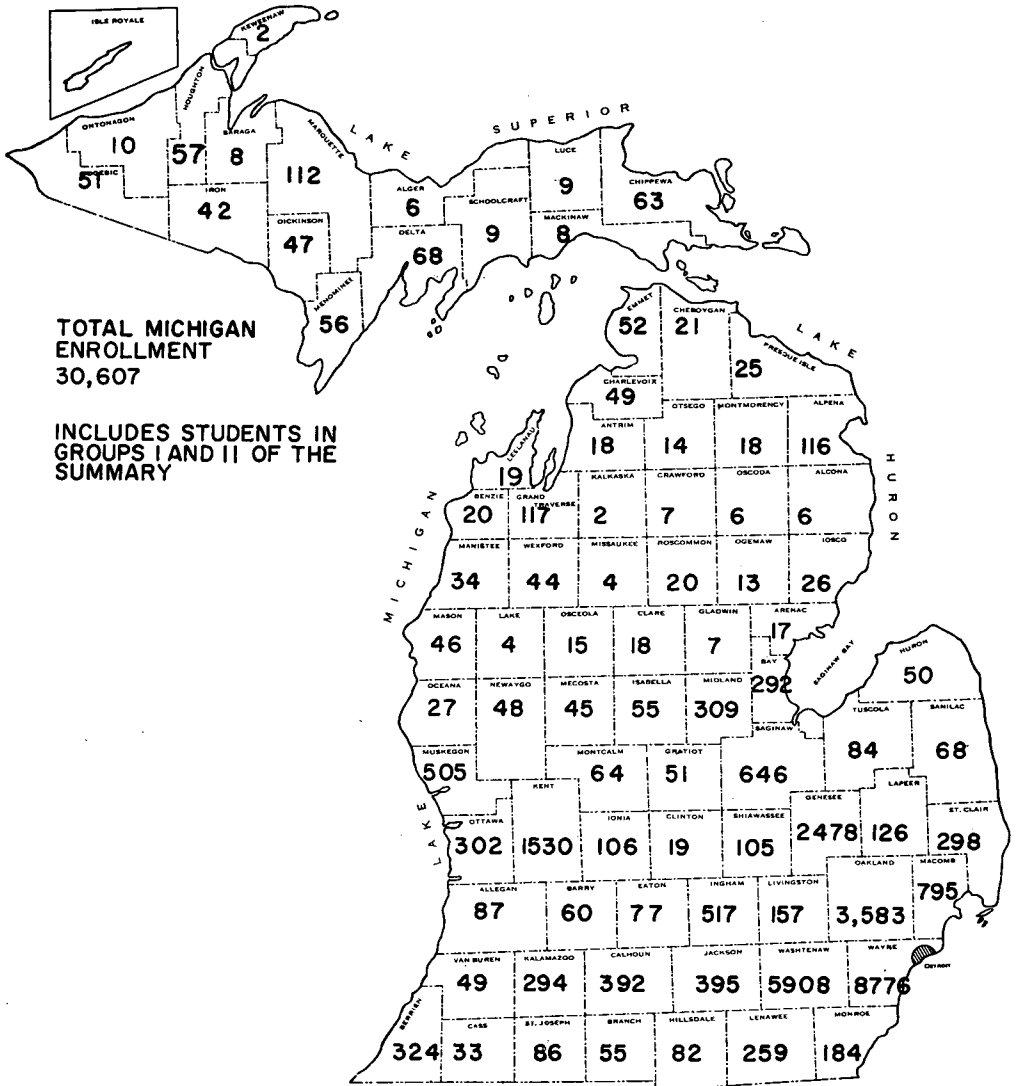

RETURNING STUDENTS, FRESHMEN, AND TRANSFER STUDENTS

The student population is increased by over thirty per cent of new students each fall semester. New freshmen comprise about thirteen per cent, transfer students from other colleges about fifteen per cent, readmitted students nearly four per cent, and new students enrolled during the summer the remainder. Over two out of three spring enrollees continue in the fall.

Precise data on new students can be noted by examination of the tables that follow. These tables used in conjunction with others in the report will give information relative to new, continuing, and returning students by units.
