FOREWORD

By means of tabulations and pictorial form, the 1967-68 student population of The University of Michigan is presented in statistical summary. Enrollment information, degrees conferred, academic achievement and other interesting data are summarized. The Statistical Service of the Registrar's Office, which in part prepared this report, can provide selected additional data complementary to these materials.

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OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR
ENROLLMENT

Each year since 1952, the fall residence credit enrollment has surpassed the previous year. In the fall of 1967, 34,514 students were enrolled in degree programs. This represents a 103% increase during this fifteen year period. Another 2,769 students were enrolled for credit courses in University centers. During the year 1967-68, a total of 48,551 students enrolled in credit programs. An additional 3,503 participated in extramural certificate programs culminating in a total enrollment of 53,689 students.

The tables and figures that follow describe in detail the enrollment by sex, term and unit at the University. Prescribed procedures were followed in accounting for the number of students registered at the University. The year includes the 1967 Summer Half-term, the 1967-68 Fall Term, the 1967-68 Winter Term, and the 1968 Spring Half-term. Only those students who remained beyond the total refund limit in any period are included. Postgraduate registrations are considered to be short-course enrollments if less than four weeks in the summer or spring, or less than eight weeks during the regular term. Any apparent numerical discrepancies in the total are the result of students enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total. All Rackham students are counted in the unit of their field of specialization.

Extramural students in certificate programs in Group III are counted in the summary only. All other groups mentioned in the summary are included in the table on geographical distribution of students since they constitute a service of instruction to the people of the state, the nation, and other areas.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follows:

1967-1968

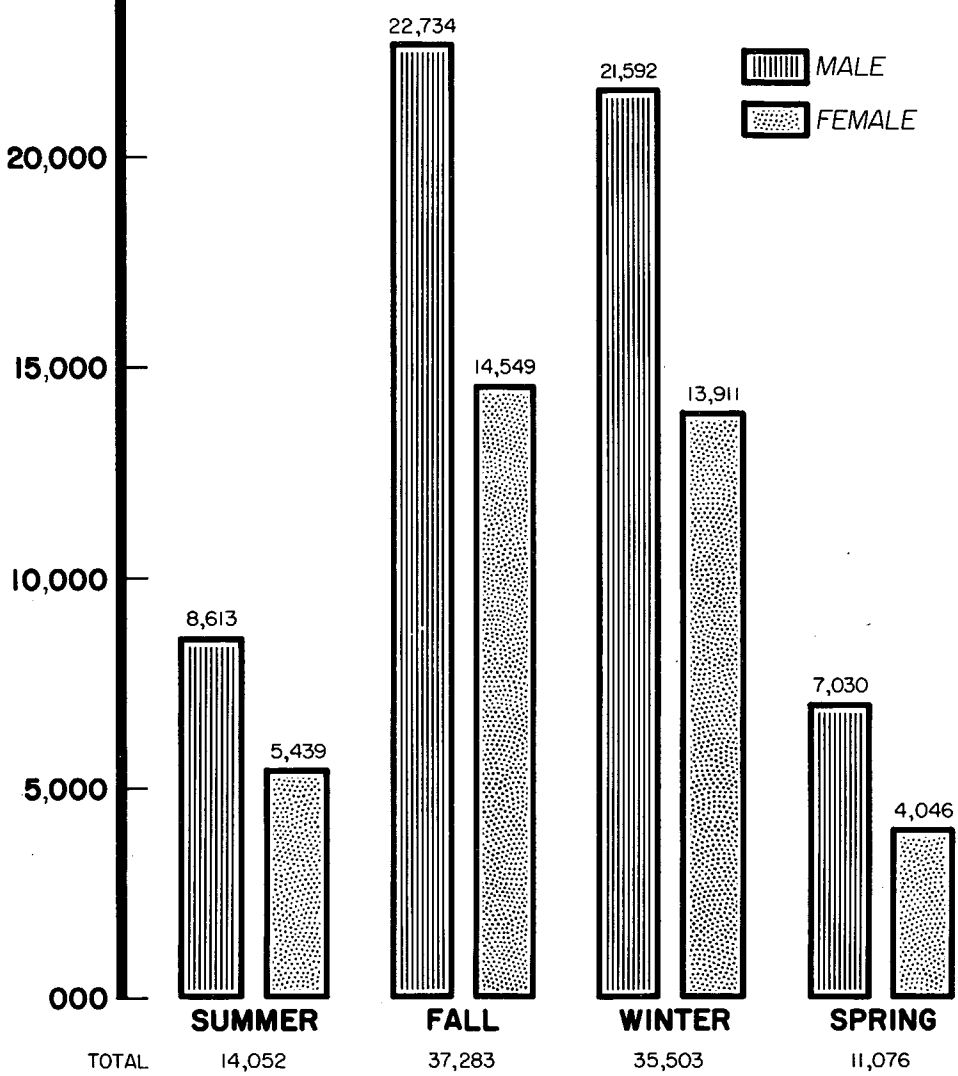

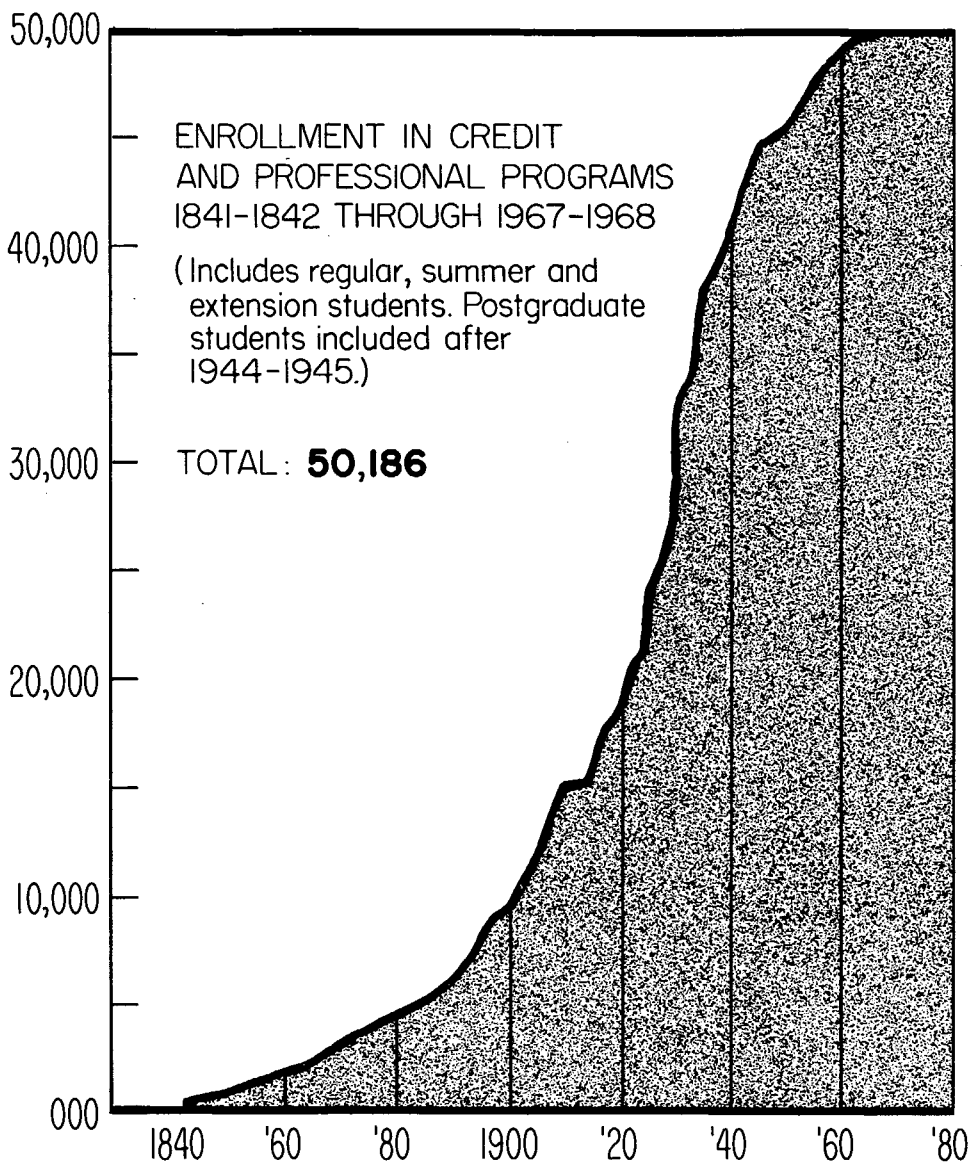

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE STUDENT POPULATION

Requests for data on our student population are continually received from various sources within the University, governmental agencies, individuals, news media, planning groups, industrial agencies, and publishing houses. Answers to the wide variety of these inquiries can generally be found from the following data, combined with the information contained in other sections of this report. The tables included in this section describe certain aspects of the student population, such as, class enrollments, marital status, and enrollments by field in selected units. Consistent data definitions are maintained from year to year so that meaningful comparisons can be made. Student population characteristics remain relatively stable and the changes that do occur are usually of a slow predictable nature.

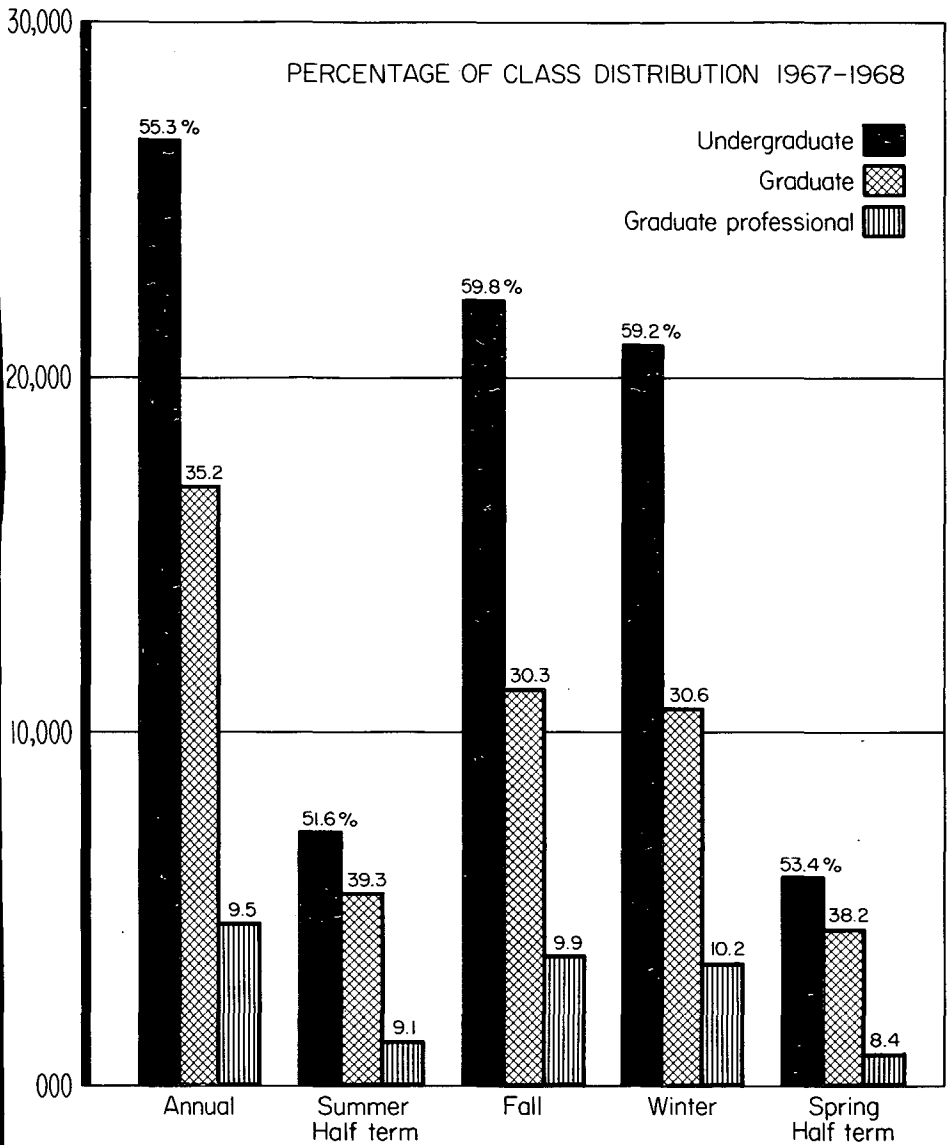

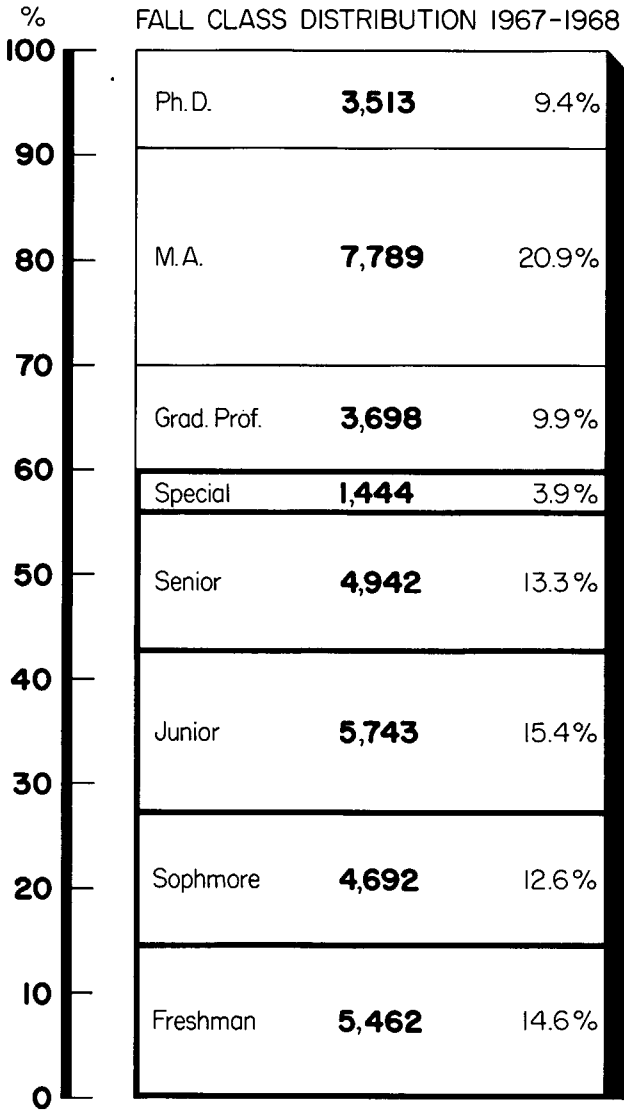

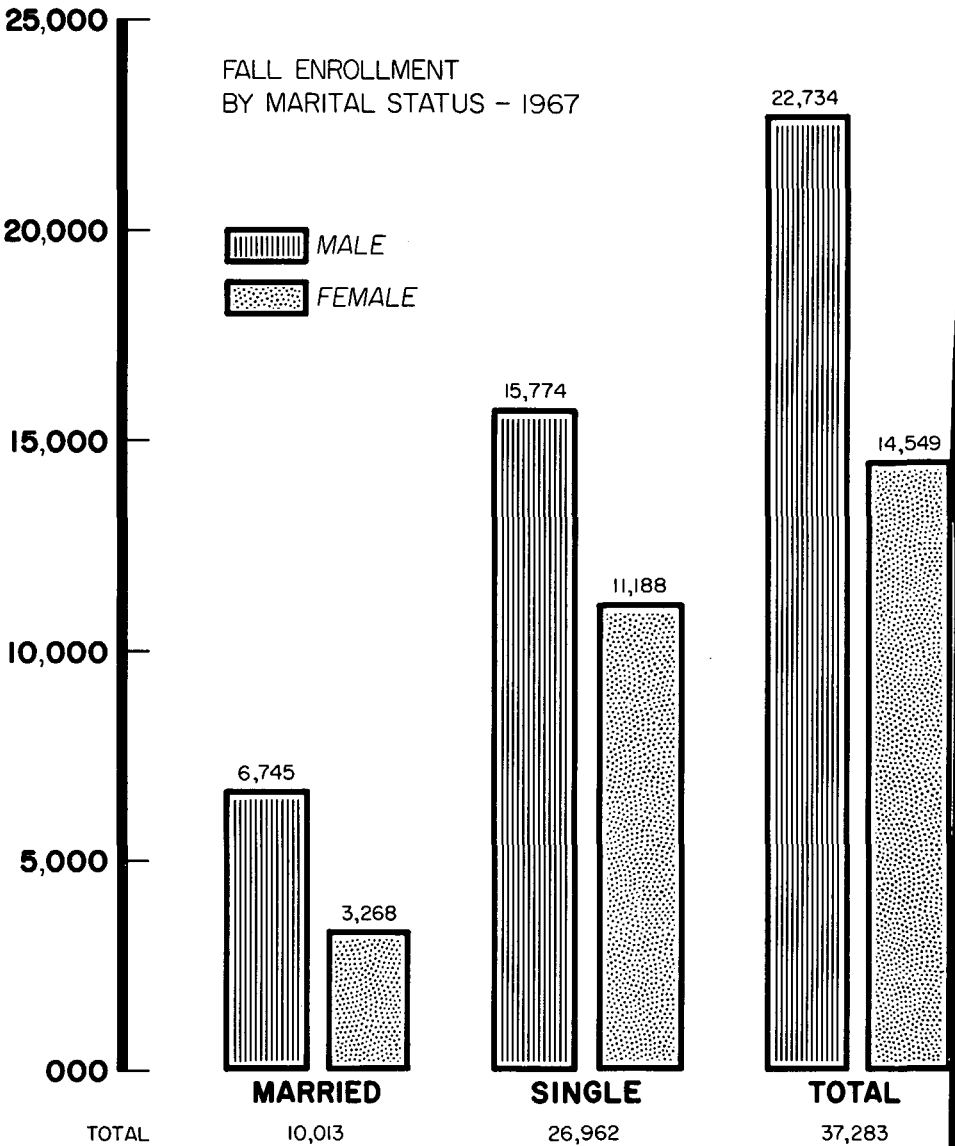

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

The academic achievement of undergraduate students for the year 1967-68 is represented in the tables which follow. As in the past, these tables indicate the academic achievement of selected groups during the fall and winter terms. The overall average for men and women has again increased and as usual the higher average was achieved by the women.

Not included in these tables are students in the graduate or graduate professional units of the School of Business Administration, the School of Dentistry, the Graduate School, the Law School, the Medical School, the School of Music, the School of Natural Resources, College of Pharmacy, the School of Public Health, and the School of Social Work. Also, students enrolled at the Dearborn Campus and the Flint College are excluded.

A table indicating the grade-point averages by selected schools is included. These averages are calculated for undergraduates who are enrolled in the same school or college both terms and who elect twelve or more hours each term.

The forty-fifth Honors Convocation, held on March 29, 1968, recognized the achievement of 2,373 undergraduate students who attained a grade-point average of 3.5 for the past two terms or freshmen who had earned this average during the first term. Over the past ten years, the percentage of eligible students honored has more than doubled, from 5.42 percent in 1958 to the current level of 11.62 percent.

DEGREES AND AWARDS

In addition to 48 honorary degrees, a record number of 8,881 degrees in course were conferred in the year 1967-68. Represented in the 8,881 total are 102 different degrees in 214 defined fields of specialization. This constitutes 20% of the yearly total or almost 26% of the fall total students enrolled in degree programs. Of the 8,881 degrees granted, 48.3 percent were bachelor's degrees, 33.9 percent master's degrees, 6.2 percent doctorates, and 11.6 percent graduate-professional degrees.

A total of 240,293 degrees have been conferred since 1845. President Harlan H. Hatcher conferred 101,718 degrees during the period of 1951-1967. This is a greater number than conferred during the first 100 years of the University.

The University grants many certificates of specialization, certificates of graduation, teacher's certificates and commissions. Over 1400 of these, by type of award are included in Table XX. Also included in Table XX, are 676 certificates of candidacy.

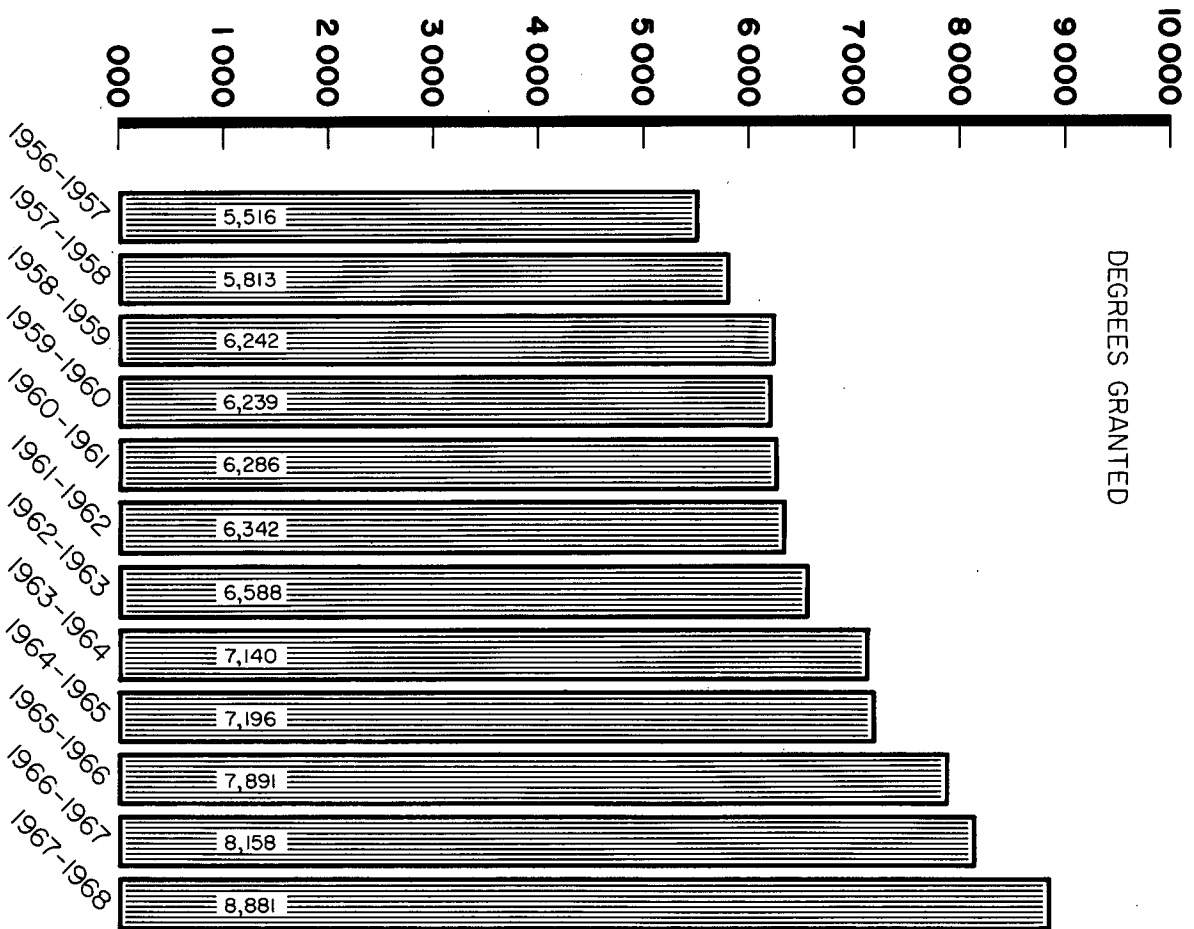

For the first time in several years, the University did not enroll students from every county in Michigan. However, in terms of number and percentage, student enrollment from Michigan continued to rise.

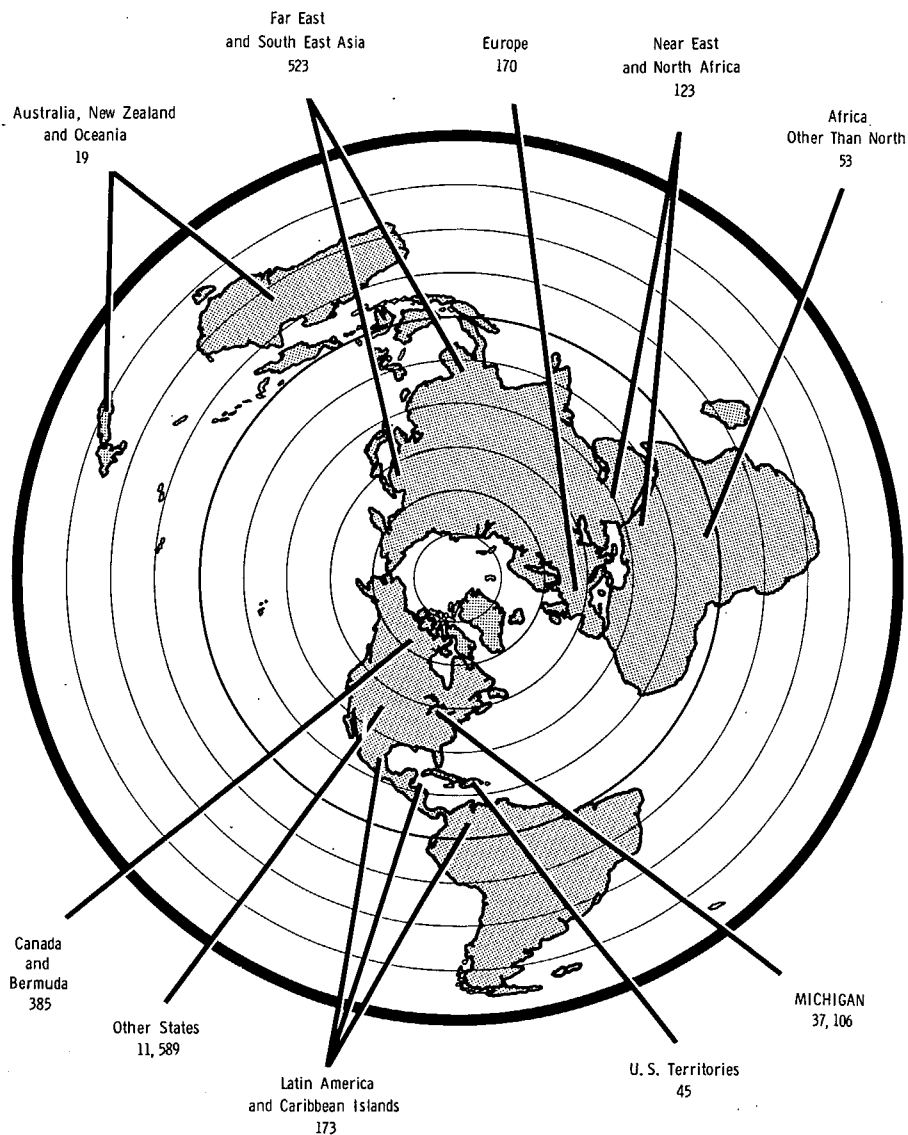
In attendance were students from every state, the District of Columbia, the Canal Zone, Guam, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and 107 foreign countries.
