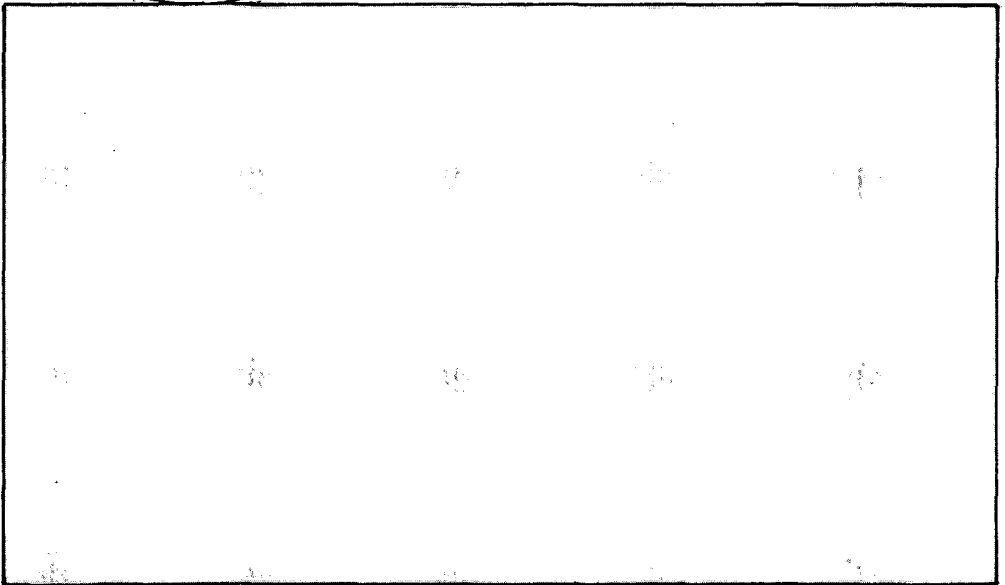

## OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR

### STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND CHARACTERISTICS

This is the eighteenth consecutive year that the residence credit enrollment has surpassed the previous year. In the fall of 1970, 37,396 students were enrolled for residence credit in degree programs, resulting in a 120% increase in fall enrollment since 1952. Another 2,265 students were enrolled for credit courses in University extension centers. A total of 54,391 students enrolled in credit and professional programs during the year 1970-1971. An additional 3,434 participated in extramural certificate programs culminating in a total enrollment of 57,825 students.

Requests for data on our student population are continually received from various sources within the University, governmental agencies, individuals, news media, planning groups, industrial agencies, and publishing houses. Answers to the wide variety of these inquiries can generally be found from the following data, combined with the information contained in other sections of this report. The tables included in this section describe in detail certain aspects of the student population, such as, class enrollments, marital status and enrollments by field in selected units. Consistent data definitions are maintained from year to year so that meaningful comparison can be made.

Prescribed procedures were followed in accounting for the number of students registered at the University. The year included the 1970 Summer Half-term, the 1970-71 Fall Term, the 1970-71 Winter Term and the 1971 Spring Half-term. Only those students who remained beyond the total refund limit in any period are included. Postgraduate registrations are considered to be short-course enrollment if less than four weeks in the summer or spring, or less than eight weeks during the regular term. Any apparent numerical discrepancies in the total are the result of students enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total. All Rackham students are counted in the unit of their field of specialization.

Students in short postgraduate Dentistry and Medicine in Group I B, postgraduate professional medicine in Group II B, and extramural certificate programs in Group III are counted in the summary only. All other groups mentioned in the summary are included in the tables on geographical distribution of students.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follows:
