FOREWORD

By means of tabulations the 1971-1972 student population of The University of Michigan is presented in statistical summary. Enrollment information, degrees conferred, academic achievement and other interesting data are summarized. The Statistical Service of the Registrar's Office, which in part prepared this report, can provide selected additional data complementary to these materials.

STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND CHARACTERISTICS

This is the nineteenth consecutive year that the total residence credit enrollment has surpassed the previous year. These gains, however, were registered at the Flint and Dearborn campuses while enrollments at Ann Arbor declined slightly. In the Fall of 1971, 38,016 students were enrolled for residence credit in degree programs, resulting in a 122% increase in Fall enrollment since 1952. Another 1,970 students were enrolled for credit courses in University extension centers. A total of 57,117 students enrolled in credit and professional programs during the year 1971-1972. An additional 3,954 participated in extramural certificate programs culminating in a total enrollment of 61,071 students.

Requests for data on our student population are continually received from various sources within the University, governmental agencies, individuals, news media, planning groups, industrial agencies, and publishing houses. Answers to the wide variety of these inquiries can generally be found from the following data, combined with the information contained in other sections of this report. The tables included in this section describe in detail certain aspects of the student population, such as, class enrollments, marital status and enrollments by field in selected units. Consistent data definitions are maintained from year to year so that meaningful comparison can be made.

Prescribed procedures were followed in accounting for the number of students registered at the University. The year included the 1971 Summer Half-term, the 1971-1972 Fall Term, the 1971-1972 Winter Term, and the 1972 Spring Half-term. Postgraduate registrations are considered to be short-course enrollment if less than four weeks in the Summer or Spring, or less than eight weeks during the regular term. Any apparent numerical discrepancies in the total are the result of students enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total. All Rackham students are counted in the unit of their field of specialization.

Students in short postgraduate Dentistry and Medicine in Group I B, postgraduate professional medicine in Group II B, and extramural certificate programs in Group III are counted in the summary only. All other groups mentioned in the summary are included in the tables on geographical distribution of students.

In most tables, the information for Dearborn and Flint has been separated to enable the development of information sets for any one of the campuses or the entire University. Comparisons with previous years should be carefully developed to include similar data elements.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follows:
