FOREWORD

Information related to the 1974-1975 student population of The University of Michigan is presented in tabular summary. Enrollment information, degrees conferred, academic achievement, and other interesting data are presented in a format that is consistent with reports of other years. Information in most Tables pertains exclusively to the Ann Arbor Campus. Only in Tables VII, VIII, and IX and in the section on "Degrees and Awards" has data for The University of Michigan-Dearborn and The University of Michigan-Flint been included. Such data was supplied by the individual units. Selected complementary information is available upon request in the Office of the University Registrar.

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STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND CHARACTERISTICS

For the twenty-second consecutive year, the total residence credit enrollment has surpassed that of the previous year. These gains were registered at all three campuses. In the Fall of 1974, 42,495 students were enrolled for residence credit in degree programs as compared to 16,985 in the Fall of 1952. This represents an increase of 146% since 1952. In addition, another 1,977 students were enrolled for credit courses in University extension centers in Fall, 1974. Interestingly enough, although the Fall enrollment was at an all-time high, the total number of students enrolled in credit and professional programs during 1974-1975 declined to 53,068. Part of this decline can be attributed to the exclusion of some short postgraduate programs and also to the fact that Dearborn and Flint figures have not been included in this annual total. An additional 2,550 participated in extramural certificate programs, culminating in a total enrollment of 55,618 students on the Ann Arbor Campus.

Requests for data on the Ann Arbor student population are continually received from various sources within the University, governmental agencies, individuals, news media, planning groups, and other interested persons. Answers to the wide variety of these inquiries relative to the Ann Arbor Campus and very limited information about The University of Michigan-Dearborn and The University of Michigan-Flint can generally be found from the following data, combined with the information contained in other sections of this report. The tables included in this section describe in detail certain aspects of the student population, such as class enrollments or enrollments by field in student units. Consistent data definitions are maintained from year to year so that meaningful comparisons can be made.

Prescribed procedures were followed in accounting for the number of students registered at the University. The year included the 1974 Summer Half-term, the 1974-1975 Fall Term, the 1974-1975 Winter Term, and the 1975 Spring Half-term. Postgraduate registrations are considered to be short-course enrollment if less than four weeks in the Summer or Spring, or less than eight weeks during the regular term. Any apparent numerical discrepancies in the total are the result of students enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total. All Rackham students are counted in the unit of their field of specialization.

Students in short postgraduate Medicine in Group I B are counted in the summary only. All other groups associated with the Ann Arbor Campus that are mentioned in the summary are included in the tables on geographical distribution of students.

In those few tables when the information for Dearborn and Flint was available, it was separated to enable the development of information sets for any one of the campuses or the entire University. Comparisons with previous years should therefore be most carefully developed to include similar data elements.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follows:
