

FOREWORD

Information related to the 1975-1976 student population of The University of Michigan-Ann Arbor is presented in tabular summary. Enrollment information, degrees conferred, academic achievement, geographic origin, and other data are presented in a format that is consistent with reports of previous years. A summary of graduate enrollment by major academic discipline and a report of grades earned by student unit have been added this year. Other minor changes have been made in several other reports in order to provide more extensive information. Additional complementary data is available upon request in the Office of the University Registrar.

In addition to information for the Ann Arbor Campus, Tables VII, VIII, and IX and the section on "Degrees and Awards" contain data for The University of Michigan-Dearborn and The University of Michigan-Flint. This data was supplied by the individual units.

STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND CHARACTERISTICS

For the twenty-third consecutive year, the total residence credit enrollment has surpassed that of the previous year. These gains were registered at all three campuses. In the Fall of 1975, 44,648 students were enrolled for residence credit degree programs as compared to 16,895 in the Fall of 1952. This represents an increase of 163% since 1952. In addition, another 1,189 students were enrolled for credit courses in University extension centers in Fall, 1975. The total number of students enrolled in credit and professional programs during 1975-1976 was 54,559, an increase over 1974-1975. As was done last year, figures for The University of Michigan-Dearborn and The University of Michigan-Flint have not been included in this annual total. An additional 2,155 participated in extramural certificate programs, culminating in a total enrollment of 56,714 students on the Ann Arbor Campus.

Requests for data on the Ann Arbor student population are continually received from various sources within the University, governmental agencies, individuals, news media, planning groups, and other interested persons. Answers to the wide variety of these inquiries relative to the Ann Arbor Campus can generally be found in the tables presented in this first section. Limited information relative to The University of Michigan-Dearborn and The University of Michigan-Flint is also available. The tables included in this first section describe in detail various aspects of the student population, such as enrollments by class level or by field of specialization within the various schools and colleges of the University. These tables, combined with the information contained in the other sections of this report, present a fairly diverse and informative picture of students at the University. Consistent data definitions are maintained from year to year so that meaningful comparisons can be made.

Prescribed procedures were followed in accounting for the number of students registered at the University. The year included the 1975 Summer Half-term, the 1975-1976 Fall Term, the 1975-1976 Winter Term, and the 1976 Spring Half-term. Postgraduate registrations are considered to be short-course enrollments if less than four weeks in the Summer or Spring, or less than eight weeks during the regular term. Any apparent numerical discrepancies in the total are the result of students enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total. All Rackham students are counted in the unit of their field of specialization.

Students in short postgraduate Medicine in Group I B are counted in the summary only. All other groups associated with the Ann Arbor Campus that are mentioned in the summary are included in the tables on geographical distribution of students.

In those tables when the information for The University of Michigan-Dearborn and The University of Michigan-Flint is presented, it is separated to enable the development of information sets for any one of the campuses or for the entire University. Comparisons with previous years should therefore be most carefully developed to insure that they include similar data elements.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follows:

I-A	Students in University degree or postgraduate professional residence credit level programs, Ann Arbor and Other Locations	44,692
I-B	Students in University postgraduate professional programs of fewer than four weeks in the half term or fewer than eight weeks during a full term	7,161
