FOREWORD

Information related to the 1976-1977 student population of The University of Michigan-Ann Arbor is presented in tabular summary. Enrollment information, degrees conferred, academic achievement, geographic origin, and other data are presented in a format that is consistent with reports of previous years. It can be noted that several tables have been revised to provide several years of data so that trend analyses can be developed. In addition, in some areas a brief prose analysis based on the statistics has been presented. Additional complementary information on many of the topics presented is available upon request from the Office of the University Registrar.

In addition to information for the Ann Arbor Campus, Tables VII, VIII, and IX and the section on "Degrees and Awards" contain data for The University of Michigan-Dearborn and The University of Michigan-Flint. This data was supplied by the individual units and any supplemental information required may be requested from their respective Registrar's offices.

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STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND CHARACTERISTICS

For the twenty-fourth consecutive year, the total residence credit enrollment of The University of Michigan has surpassed that of the previous year. In the Fall of 1976, 44,869 students were enrolled for residence credit degree programs at all three campuses. This represents an increase of 166% since 1952 when the University consisted of one campus only. In addition, another 954 students were enrolled in credit courses at University extension centers, bringing the total enrollment at all three campuses to 45,823.

For the Ann Arbor Campus, the total number of students enrolled in credit and professional programs during the 1976-1977 academic year was 52,251. An additional 1,424 participated in extramural certificate Medicine programs for a total enrollment of 53,675.




Figure 1. Residence Credit Enrollment by Class Level, Ann Arbor Campus, Fall Terms

Figure 1 below illustrates the growth pattern of the Ann Arbor Campus over the past 26 years. The class level composition of the total enrollment is shown both as an actual figure and as a percent of the total. From this, several trends can be noted:

(1) In the past 26 years, the total enrollment has risen considerably. This growth has since leveled off beginning in Fall, 1975 when indications of a downward trend first became evident. With respect to class levels, the following can be noted:

Undergraduates	Up 55%
Graduates	Up 45%
Graduate-Professionals	Up 60%

(2) Expressed as a percent of the total enrollment, the following information by class levels can be noted:

Undergraduates	Up .9%
Graduates	Down 1.4%
Graduate-Professionals	Up .5%

Enrollment growth by the various class levels has therefore been fairly consistent with the exception of Graduate students which now shows a downward trend. Although not shown in this particular table, it can be noted that enrollment of women students on the Ann Arbor Campus has risen 83% in this same time period.

Requests for data on the Ann Arbor student population are continually received from various sources within the University, governmental agencies, individuals, news media, planning groups, and other interested persons. Answers to the wide variety of these inquiries relative to the Ann Arbor Campus can generally be found in the tables presented in this first section. Limited information relative to The University of Michigan-Flint and The University of Michigan-Dearborn is also included. The tables included in this first section describe in detail various aspects of the student population. These tables, combined with the information contained in the other sections of this report, present a fairly diverse and informative picture of students at the University. Consistent data definitions are maintained from year to year so that meaningful comparisons can be made.

Prescribed procedures were followed in accounting for the number of students registered at the University. The year included the 1976 Summer Half-term, the 1976-1977 Fall Term, the 1976-1977 Winter Term, and the 1977 Spring Half-term. Any apparent numerical discrepancies in the total are the result of students enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total. All Rackham students are counted in the unit of their field of specialization, except where noted otherwise.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follows:

I-A	Students in University degree or postgraduate professional residence credit level programs, Ann Arbor and Other Locations	43,580
I-B	Students in University postgraduate professional programs of fewer than four weeks in the half term or fewer than eight weeks during a full term	6,484
II-A	Students in University Extension credit courses offered in nearly forty Michigan communities including the following five cities with extension offices: Flint, Dearborn, Detroit, Grand Rapids, and Saginaw	1,914
II-B	Students in University Extension credit courses offered through the Department of Independent Study	854
III-A	Students in University Extension certificate classes designed to assist the mature individual who is seeking continued study along lines not covered in regular University courses	1,403

The table below compares selected characteristics of the freshman class who enrolled at The University of Michigan in 1970 with that enrolled in 1976. The nationally-recognized trend of lower Scholastic Aptitude Test scores for entering freshmen is here also reflected for University of Michigan freshmen. Further data compiled by the Office of Undergraduate Admissions of The University of Michigan shows that in 1970, 45% of entering University of Michigan freshmen had graduated in the top 5% of their high school class. By 1976, this figure had dropped to less than 37%. It can also be noted that Table XVII in the "Academic Achievement" section of this report shows that the average grade-point average achieved by new freshmen during their first term at the University rose from 2.78 in 1970 to 2.89 in 1976.
