FOREWORD

Information related to the 1977-1978 student population of The University of Michigan-Ann Arbor is presented in tabular summary. Enrollment information, degrees conferred, academic achievement, geographic origin, and other data are presented in a format that is consistent with reports of previous years. It can be noted that several tables have been revised to provide several years of data so that trends can be noted. Additional complementary information on many of the topics presented is available upon request from the Office of the University Registrar.

In addition to information for the Ann Arbor Campus, Tables VII, VIII, and IX and the section on "Degrees and Awards" contain data for The University of Michigan-Dearborn and The University of Michigan-Flint. This data was supplied by the individual units and any supplemental information required may be requested from their respective Registrar's Offices.

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STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND CHARACTERISTICS

In the Fall of 1977, 45,235 students were enrolled for residence credit degree programs at all three campuses of The University of Michigan. In addition, another 786 students were enrolled in credit courses at University extension centers, bringing the total enrollment at all three campuses to 46,021. Although the total residence credit enrollment at The University of Michigan has risen steadily for the past 25 years, enrollment at the Ann Arbor campus has decreased each of the past 3 years.

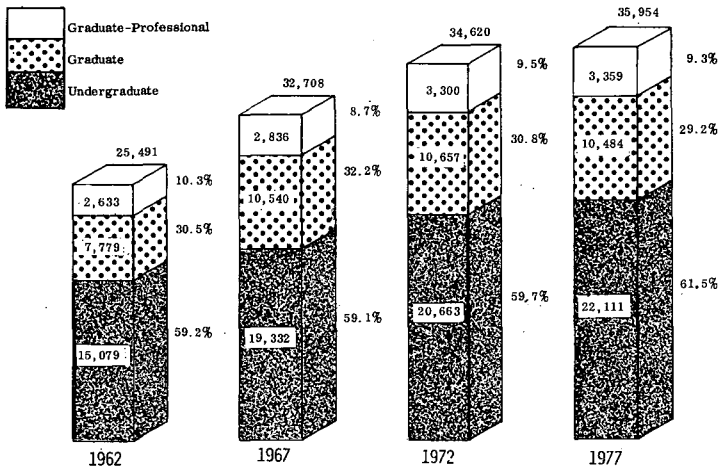


Figure 1. Residence Credit Enrollment by Class Level, Ann Arbor Campus, Fall Terms

Figure 1 illustrates enrollment at the Ann Arbor campus since 1962. It can be seen that the increase in the number and percentage of undergraduate students has been offset by a decrease in the number and percentage of students at the graduate level, while enrollment of students in graduate-professional programs has remained reasonably constant.

The tables included in this first section describe in detail various aspects of the student population. These tables, combined with information contained in other sections of the Report, present a fairly diverse and informative picture of students at the University. Consistent data definitions are maintained from year to year so that meaningful comparisons can be made.

Prescribed procedures were followed in accounting for the number of students registered at the University. The year included the 1977 Summer Half-term, the 1977 Fall Term, the 1978 Winter Term, and the 1978 Spring Half-term. Any apparent numerical discrepancies in the total are the result of students enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total. All Rackham students are counted in the unit of their field of specialization, except where noted otherwise.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follows:

I-A	Students in University degree or postgraduate professional residence credit level programs, Ann Arbor and Other Locations	43,342
I-B	Students in University Postgraduate professional programs of fewer than four weeks in the half term or fewer than eight weeks during a full term	6,619
II-A	Students in University Extension credit courses offered in nearly forty Michigan communities including the following five cities with extension offices: Flint, Dearborn, Detroit, Grand Rapids, and Saginaw	1,816
II-B	Students in University Extension credit courses offered through the Department of Independent Study	710
III-A	Students in University Extension certificate classes designed to assist the mature individual who is seeking continued study along lines not covered in regular University courses	1,866

Table XXV compares Scholastic Aptitude Test scores of the freshman classes that entered The University of Michigan from 1969 to 1977. The declining SAT scores indicated in the table are consistent with nation-wide average SAT scores, which also declined during these years.

Although not indicated below, 37% of the freshmen entering The University of Michigan in the Fall Term of 1977 graduated in the top 5% of their high school class.
