FOREWORD

Information related to the 1980-1981 student population of The University of Michigan-Ann Arbor is presented in tabular summary. Enrollment information, degrees conferred, academic achievement, geographic origin and other data are presented in a format that is consistent with reports of previous years. Many of the tables provide several years of data so that trends can be noted. Additional complementary information is available upon request from the Office of the University Registrar.

In addition to information for the Ann Arbor Campus, Tables II, VII, VIII, and IX and the section on "Degrees and Awards" contain data for The University of Michigan-Dearborn and The University of Michigan-Flint. This data was supplied by the individual units and any supplemental information required may be requested from their respective Registrar's Offices.

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STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND CHARACTERISTICS

In the Fall of 1980, 46,440 students were enrolled in residence credit degree programs at all three campuses of the University of Michigan. In addition, another 641 students were enrolled at University extension centers, bringing the total Fall enrollment to 47,081. The Ann Arbor and Dearborn campuses experienced only slight changes in enrollment (+1% and -1%, respectively), while the Flint campus had an increase in enrollment of 7%.

Ann Arbor Campus

At the Ann Arbor campus, the proportion of undergraduate students continued to increase slightly. The loss at the graduate level is attributed to a decline in the number of students enrolled in the Horace H. Rackham School of Graduate Studies. However, there were slight increases in non-Rackham graduate and graduate-professional enrollment.

The percentage of women increased at the undergraduate level and decreased at the graduate level. At the undergraduate level, the percentage of women enrolled increased most noticeably in Business Administration (from 39% to 45.4%), Architecture & Urban Planning (from 24.5% to 29.9%), Education (from 57.3% to 62.2%), and Engineering (from 15% to 17.4%). At the graduate level, although the total percentage of women decreased, the following units had increases in the percentage of women enrolled: Architecture & Urban Planning, Business Administration, Education, Engineering, Literature, Science & Arts, and Public Health.

The percentage of part-time students decreased from 14.2% to 12.9% in Fall 1980 (this represents a decrease of 438 part-time students). This decrease occurred almost exclusively at the graduate level. The decrease was proportionate for men and women.

Dearborn Campus

Although the Dearborn campus experienced only a slight change in total enrollment (-40), the mix of students changed. Graduate enrollment decreased by 50 students, solely attributable to a decline in the number of male graduate students. Undergraduate enrollment increased by only 10 students; however, the proportion of men and women changed. The number of undergraduate women increased by 71 (from 45.5% to 46.7%), while undergraduate men decreased by 61.

Flint Campus

Enrollment at the Flint campus increased at both the undergraduate (+234 or +5.8%) and graduate (+54 or +79.4%) levels. The proportion of men and women varied only slightly, with women accounting for 55.2% (previously 54.5%) of the total enrollment.

More specific information relative to student enrollment is included in the tables in this first section. These tables, combined with information contained in other sections of the report, present an informative picture of the diverse student population at the University. Consistent data definitions are maintained from year to year so that meaningful comparisons can be made.

Prescribed procedures were followed in accounting for the number of students registered at the University. The year included the 1980 Summer Half-term, the 1980 Fall Term, the 1981 Winter Term, and the 1981 Spring Half-term. Any apparent numerical discrepancies in the total are the result of students enrolled in two or more units and counted but once in the net total. All Rackham students are counted in the unit of their field of specialization, except where noted otherwise.

In the summary, enrollments have been divided into groups as follow:

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

This section contains tables portraying the academic achievement of undergraduate students at the Ann Arbor Campus. In total, the grade-point averages of students did not vary significantly from the prior year. The overall grade-point average for students was 2.95 for the Fall 1980 Term and 2.96 for the Winter 1981 Term. Women students at all class levels continued to have higher grade-point averages than the male students. For undergraduates as a whole, the grade-point average increases with class level. Consistently higher grade-point average are found in the School of Music.

The average SAT scores of the entering fall freshman class remained constant for the third year in a row. The grade-point averages earned by new freshmen in Fall 1980 were slightly lower than those earned by the preceding class of new freshmen.

DEGREES AND AWARDS

During the 1980-81 academic year, 10,954 degrees in course were awarded by the University of Michigan. This represents the largest number of degrees awarded by the University to date. At the Ann Arbor campus, 9,632 degrees were awarded (an increase of 4.4% from the prior year). At the Dearborn campus, 851 degrees were awarded (an increase of 8.7%) and 471 degrees were awarded at the Flint campus (an increase of 16.3%).

At the Ann Arbor campus, the increase was attributable to an increase in the number of baccalaureate degrees awarded. The 5,080 degrees awarded during 1980-81 represent the most baccalaureate degrees ever awarded in a single year at the Ann Arbor campus. Although 1980-81 was not a peak year for master's level degrees, a significantly higher number were awarded during 1980-81 than had been awarded during the prior year. The number of degrees awarded at the doctoral and graduate-professional level varied little from the prior year. The Flint and Dearborn campuses awarded more degrees at both the baccalaureate and master's level, with a significant increase occurring at the master's level.

The tables in this section describe degrees awarded by type of degree, sex, school or college, and field. These tables provide detailed information pertaining to the academic programs completed by students.

GEOGRAPHICAL ORIGIN OF STUDENTS

In the Fall of 1980, the students who enrolled at the University represented every county in Michigan, every state in the U.S. and the District of Columbia, 12 U.S. Territories, and 108 foreign countries. Ohio, New York and Illinois contributed the highest number of out-of-state students, with 43% of all out-of-state students originating from one of these three states. There were more than twice as many students from the Far East and Southeast Asia than from any other geographical area and these students accounted for 41% of all foreign student enrollment.

Over the past ten years, the distribution of students by geographic area has shown a marked change. Since the mid-nineteen seventies, the number of out-of-state students has increased steadily. Out-of-state students currently represent 25% of the total annual student population. Although foreign students account for only 8% of the annual student population, the total number of students from foreign countries has almost tripled over the last ten years. The geographic areas showing the largest percentage increases for this period are the Near East and North Africa region and the Latin America and the Caribbean region.

Tables in this section portray the geographic distribution of students. Detailed information by University group and geographic area may be obtained from the tables.

NEW STUDENTS

The number of new freshmen enrolling for the Fall, 1980 Term increased by 234 (+5.5%) compared to the prior year. This was the largest entering freshman class in the past five years. Except for Education and Nursing, all of the undergraduate units had higher enrollments of new freshmen. New freshmen came from 74 of the 84 Michigan counties, from 44 of the other 49 states, from 3 U.S. territories, and from 42 foreign countries.

The number of new transfers entering in the Fall of 1980 also increased (+125 or +2.9%) compared to the prior year. However, the number of new transfers in 1980 was still not as large as had been experienced during most of the 1970's. New transfers came from 67 Michigan counties, all 50 states, 1 U.S. territory, and 87 foreign countries.
