FOREWORD

The Annual Report of the University Registrar presents data on enrollment, academic achievement, degrees and awards, geographic origin of students, and new students on the Ann Arbor campus. In some instances, data supplied by the Dearborn and Flint campus Registrars have also been included.

Comments on this report are invited and should be directed to the University Registrar's office in Ann Arbor. Questions on data pertaining to Dearborn or Flint should be directed to the appropriate Registrar's Office.

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STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND CHARACTERISTICS

In the Fall Term, 1981, 46,407 students were enrolled in residence credit degree programs at all three campuses of The University of Michigan. In addition, 454 students were enrolled in the credit extension program, bringing the total Fall enrollment to 46,861. Enrollment at the Ann Arbor campus declined by 1.25% from last year, while enrollment at the Dearborn and Flint campuses increased by 3.4% and 4.5% respectively.

Ann Arbor Campus

The proportion of undergraduate to graduate students shifted slightly to the undergraduates as compared to last year. Undergraduate enrollment in the Fall Term, 1981, decreased slightly in most units; those with the greatest decline were Dentistry, Education, Music, Nursing, and Pharmacy. Enrollment in Art, Business Administration, Engineering, and Natural Resources increased.

There was a decrease in graduate enrollment in most units, with Education experiencing the sharpest drop. Business Administration posted a sharp increase; enrollment in Engineering, Law, Nursing and Pharmacy also increased.

The proportion of women enrolled remained virtually unchanged. At the undergraduate level, significant increases occurred in Engineering and LS & A, while Education and Nursing posted sharp decreases. At the graduate level, Law, Business Administration, and Pharmacy had significant increases. Education had a sharp decrease; decreases in other units, most notably Music, Public Health, and Rackham, were more modest.

A drop in part-time undergraduate enrollment accounted for most of the total enrollment changes; full-time undergraduate enrollment increased substantially, particularly for women. Both full-time and part-time enrollment at the graduate level declined.

Dearborn Campus

The overall increase in enrollment is accounted for almost totally by women. Most of this increase was at the undergraduate level. The proportion of women in the campus increased by almost two percentage points.

Flint Campus

An increase in undergraduate enrollment accounted for most of the overall increase, with the number of women one-third higher than the number of men. At the graduate level, virtually all of the increase is accounted for by men.

DEGREES AND AWARDS

During the 1981-82 academic year, 11,059 degrees in course were awarded by The University of Michigan, 105 more than in the previous year. The slight increase is attributable for the most part to an increase in bachelor's and doctor's degrees, 6,292 to 6,379 and 552 to 605, respectively. The number of master's degrees awarded remained virtually unchanged, while intermediate and graduate-professional declined.

At the Ann Arbor campus, 9,683 degrees were awarded. Nine hundred and sixteen degrees were awarded at the Dearborn Campus; 460 were awarded at Flint. This is an increase over last year at 0.5% and 7.6% for Ann Arbor and Dearborn, respectively, and a decrease of 2.3% for Flint.

At the Ann Arbor campus, the 5,081 bachelor degrees awarded represent the most ever awarded in a single year. The number of bachelor degrees awarded at Dearborn increased by almost 14%, while there was a slight decline at Flint. Flint awarded twice as many master's (10) as in 1980-81, while the number of such degrees awarded at Ann Arbor increased slightly; at Dearborn, the number of master's degrees awarded decreased by approximately a third.
